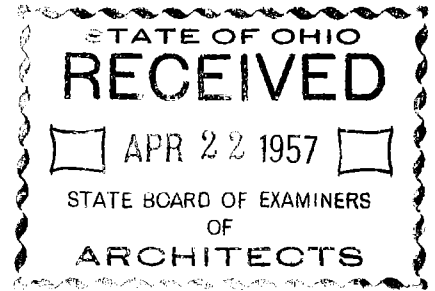

Eugene F. Kennedy, Jr., F.A.I.A., Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, who was accompanied by Messrs. Wilson and Smith of his Committee, presented cases of unprofessional conduct:

Chicago Chapter, A.I.A., vs. [REDACTED] A.I.A.

"14. An Architect shall conform to the registration laws governing the practice of architecture in any state in which he practices and he shall observe the standards of practice established by the local Architects' professional body."

"15. An Architect shall at no time act in a manner detrimental to the best interest of the profession."

WE ARE SORRY FOR THE DELAY IN ANSWERING YOUR LETTER OF OCTOBER 20, 1961, WHICH NECESSITATED YOUR TELEGRAM TO US LAST WEEK.

MR. E. KEIGH HAAG HAS BEEN A PROBLEM TO US AS YOU MIGHT WELL IMAGINE AND, ALTHOUGH HE IS VERY CAPABLE AND AN EXCELLENT DESIGNER, HE HAS HAD WHAT WE CONSIDER A RATHER UNHEALTHY ATTITUDE TOWARD THE ORGANIZATION AND THE INSTITUTE. HE OWES FOR LAST YEAR'S AND FOR THIS YEAR'S DUES; THEREFORE, WE HAVE TO SAY THAT HE IS NOT IN GOOD STANDING AT THIS TIME. HOWEVER, THE DELAY IN ANSWERING YOUR LETTER WAS CAUSED BY THE FACT THAT WE WERE GOING TO MAKE ANOTHER EFFORT TO HAVE HIM BRING EVERYTHING UP TO DATE AND BECOME A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING AS FAR AS THE EASTERN OHIO CHAPTER IS CONCERNED.



Nominee initiated a modular housing concept for single and multi-family housing units. The design consists of a kitchen/bathroom/utility/laundry/storage core containing all of the electrical, mechanical and kitchen equipment and is contained in a steel cage which becomes the ultimate structure of the building. Nominee has consummated an arrangement with the Westinghouse Corporation for the manufacture and sale of these units. The prototype model has been completed and manufacture and distribution is scheduled for early Spring, 1971. Additional explanation is attached.

Nominee originated a Composite Bidding System which has been used on most of the private work done by his office. It is generally accepted in Greater Akron area construction, and been successful in establishing a better relationship between the owner, architect, and contractor; and also in improving control and knowledge of costs.

SERVICE TO THE PROFESSION

A prime contribution of the nominee to his profession was his tenure of presidency during the first full year of operation of the Akron Chapter. Understanding and recognizing the problems of the Profession and society in general, the direction of the Chapter was changed from a socially oriented organization to a service organization.

He and his officers were responsible for eliminating all social activities from the Chapter and transferring them to the Women's Auxiliary Group, in order to spend more time and funds on meaningful programs. Two important new programs originated during his tenure:

- . A real and deepened commitment was made to the Model Cities Program which has involved ten architects from the Chapter and as many as twenty-four architectural students from the University.
- . Three major rubber manufacturing companies (Goodyear/Firestone/Goodrich) employ many architects in the Akron area. These architects in the past have had almost no connection with the AIA. Through the nominee's guidance, programs were initiated to genuinely involve these architects in the Akron Chapter.

In 1966 the nominee and a fellow architect formed a committee of principals of the Akron Area to meet monthly to discuss common interests and problems. The most noteworthy effort to emanate from this committee was formation of a two-year architectural technicians course at Kent State University. The technicians program is now in operation. The nominee's contributions were:

- . Initiating interest in the program at the University
- . Assisting in developing curriculum
- . Assisting in locating students for first classes
- . Cooperation with other firms in generating interest through Urban League and pledging financial assistance to potential students unable to afford enrolling in courses.

Nominee conceived and implemented the formation of a Trust for the collection of funds from individuals and companies allied with the building trades in the Tri-County area centering around Akron, Ohio. Money is loaned to a non-profit corporation identified as the Building Industry Group Incorporated which in turn is invested in Government Securities and Banks. The Building Industry Group's purpose is to fund worthwhile and meaningful projects affecting the environment and quality of life in the Tri-County Chapter area. Funds available would be the interest earned from these loan funds and the principal is forever unencumbered. The participants may withdraw their money at any time. The program has had its initial funding of approximately \$50,000 and additional solicitation early in 1971 will aim for a goal of \$150,000 total - the income thus derived will provide nine to twelve thousand dollars annual fund.


