



### OBITUARY FOR JACK PHILIP HERMANN

Jack Philip Hermann, A.I.A. Architect, of Kentfield died in an auto accident on September 5, 1989, while traveling near Dargaville in New Zealand. He was 71 years old.

Jack was an architect who enjoyed an active practice in San Francisco and Marin from 1946 until 1972. A vital and vigorous member of his community, he contributed his time and expertise to many volunteer organizations, including the Marin Conservation League, the National Red Cross and the Marin Audubon Society. He lived in the lower Ross Valley near the Corte Madera Creek for 43 years.

Jack was born in Topeka, Kansas on September 23, 1917 to Danish immigrant parents. Raised in San Diego, he was active in the Sea Scouts, eventually reaching the rank of Eagle Scout. It was through the scouts that he developed his lifelong love of boats and sailing.

He studied civil engineering at San Diego State College, general studies at the University of Washington, and architecture at the University of California at Berkeley. It was here that he met Winifred Nickerson, whom he married in 1942.

He apprenticed as a carpenter, surveyor, engineer and architect in California and Alaska. During World War II he designed and supervised construction of shipyards and military bases, followed by service in the US Army Aviation Engineers.

In 1946 the couple moved to Marin County where they began work on the family home in Kentfield. It was here that they raised their four children.

A partnership with San Francisco architect Bolton White was established in 1948. Their practice, which later expanded to include Allen Steinau, was responsible for the design of hospitals, clinics, churches, offices, housing, post-offices, schools, stores, recreation centers, regional master plans and open space. Notable among these are Orinda Community Church, Woodside Priory, Palo Alto Community Church, Arlington Community Church, Ross Hospital, Hobbs Wall Building, and numerous houses. In 1960, Jack chaired the A.I.A. conference on Church Architecture in San Francisco.

Separating from the partnership in 1962, Jack set up office in Marin, where his practice continued with such projects as Ross Hospital, Fairfield Intercommunity Hospital, Modesto Hospital, Pittsburg Community Church, and housing. During this time his wife Winifred, a landscape designer and artist, worked with him. In 1966 he was a co-recipient of the Govonor's Award of Exceptional Distinction in Conservation for his work on the Master Plan for the Audubon Canyon Ranch on Bolinas Lagoon.

Closing the formal architectural practice in 1972, Jack and Winifred embarked on a series of personal projects. These began with the renovation of older buildings, utilizing a creative reuse of unusual materials in energy efficient and environmentally sound ways.

In 1978 they bought 32 acres of pastureland in Point Reyes Station, with the vision of developing a self sufficient farm. They intended to use local materials, provide affordable housing, and to create goods for local consumption in an environmentally sound fashion. However, in 1981, the property was annexed by the National Park Service. The land was replaced with 17 acres in Bodega, where they worked hard implementing their dream.

After Winifred's death in 1986, Jack chose to consolidate his farming dream to a smaller site, a new home in Kentfield. The last three years of his life were marked by a peaceful and integrated life style, fruitful gardening, graceful entertaining, nurturing his grandchildren, international travel, and, as always, an inquisitive and whimsical view of the world.

He is survived by his children, Anne Lamborn of Los Gatos, Michael Hermann of Ananda, Katharine Hermann and Robin Moller of Larkspur, and six grandchildren: Jeffrey Lamborn, Simon Hermann, Arrev and Fvan Evan Lucene Chantikian, and Scott and Hayley Moller.

A Memorial Service will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, September 30, 1989, at the Creekside Park on Bon Air Road in Kentfield.
