GANNETT HERWIG, 69, ARCHITECT, IS DEAD
4/21/66

Gannett Herwig, a partner in the architectural concern of LaPierre, Litchfield & Partners, 8 West 40th Street, died of a heart attack Monday at his home at 11 Garden Place, Brooklyn. He was 69 years old.

Mr. Herwig was the exterior designer of the Brooklyn Men's House of Detention. He had been scheduled to assist Mayor Lindsay tomorrow in the groundbreaking for the League School for Seriously Disturbed Children in Brooklyn.

Mr. Herwig was in charge of the design of the Bellevue Hospital Nurses Residence; the Jamaica Savings Bank's main bank in Jamaica, Queens, and a new branch in Jackson Heights, Queens, and Veterans Administration hospitals in Manhattan and Pittsburgh.

He also was in charge of the designs at the City Housing Authority's George Washington Houses in Manhattan, the Gun Hill Houses in the Bronx and the Richmond Terrace houses in West Brighton, S. I.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Dora Miller Herwig; a son, Ellis G.; a daughter, Mrs. Marcia Metzker, and a grandchild.
