

Rather early in his career he gave an illustrated lecture on church architecture in Calvin College.

He greatly admired the beautiful in architecture and whenever possible used some terra cotta in his designs.

Then it was but natural that in his hobby he turned to the beauties in nature and grew specimen dahlias for which he wonmany awards. In 1941 he was awarded three gold medals by the American Dahlia Association. He won the Derrill W. Hart Memorial Gold Metal for the seedling which won the highest average score in three official trial gardens. In the national contest that year, open to foreign as well as American growers, he won two of four gold medals.

It was indeed a thrilling experience for him when he travelled with the American Dahlia Society to Holland, France and England in 1968. He marvelled at the beauty of the flowers and especially the architecture, which had been so great a part of him while studying at the U. of M. It was indeed an inspiration to him to worship in St. Paul's Cathedral, designed by Sir Christopher Wren.
