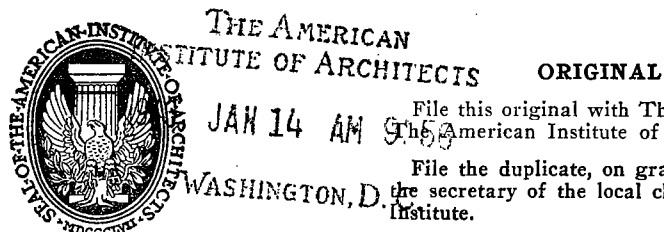

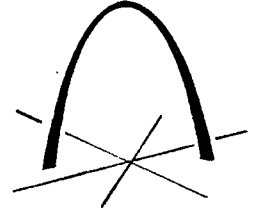

Dear Walter:

The Executive Committee of the St. Louis Chapter A.I.A. has instructed me to write to you concerning your indebtedness to the St. Louis Chapter.

Last year, on three occasions, and about February 15th, 1955, I mailed statements to you at your old address in St. Louis. I did not know until recently that you had left the city. Although none of the statements mailed to you were returned to me because of incorrect address, I do not know whether any of these statements ever reached you, and for that reason am enclosing another statement of your account.

I quote from our By-Laws as follows:

"(e) Notice of Default to the Institute. At the end of the first three months period of each fiscal year, at the end of each fiscal year, and at such other times as The Secretary of the Institute requests, the secretary of this Chapter shall send to the Secretary of the Institute a list of all members in default to this chapter with the amount of each default, and, when any such default is cured, the secretary shall immediately notify the Secretary of The Institute."

As you know, you have been assigned as a member of the St. Louis Chapter by the Octagon and we must carry your name on our roster. So far, we have not reported your delinquency and this letter is written in the hope that you will take the necessary action to remove your delinquency in order that your name can be restored to good standing. For obvious reasons we hope that you will take care of this matter immediately.

Perhaps you are considering transferring your membership to one of the Florida Chapters in order that you can more actively participate in the affairs of the A.I.A. However, I am sure that you understand such a transfer cannot be made until you have cleared your account with the St. Louis Chapter.

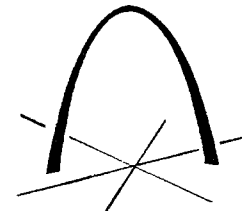

We wish to call your attention to the status of Walter J. Hubbard, a Corporate Member of the Saint Louis Chapter, whose present address is P. O. Box 1002, Naples, Florida.

Mr. Hubbard, over a period of two years had become delinquent to the extent of his 1954 dues of \$15.00, 1955 dues of \$7.50 (out-state, one-half rate) and his 1955 Regional Conference assessment of \$10.00, making a total of \$32.50 in arrears. Mr. George R. Otto, Treasurer of the Saint Louis Chapter, has notified Mr. Hubbard on several occasions during the past twelve months of his accruing delinquency to no avail. The Executive Committee of the Saint Louis Chapter, at their last Board meeting, decided to petition the Institute that this man be dropped from membership.

However, we would suggest that in your forthcoming correspondence with Mr. Hubbard you suggest his re-assignment to some local Florida Chapter, after he has cleared his delinquency, in order that he may benefit through continued A.I.A. membership. I might add that Mr. Hubbard has, in the past, demonstrated architectural ability and a stable integrity in our locality. On the other hand, the Executive Committee is at a loss as to the present delinquency.

We are forwarding a copy of this letter to Mr. Hubbard with the request that the Executive Committee would be delighted to hear from him, in the event that a misunderstanding is the basis of his present silence.




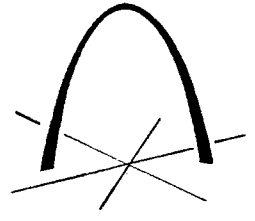
