
My dear Mr. Brown:

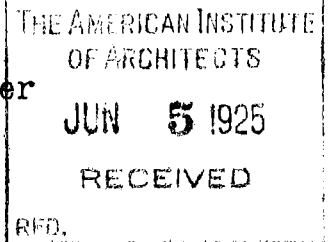

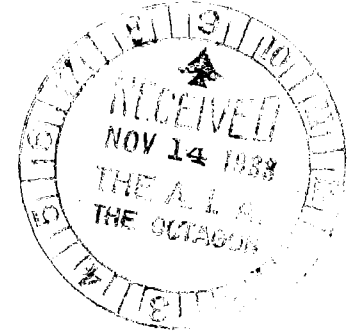
