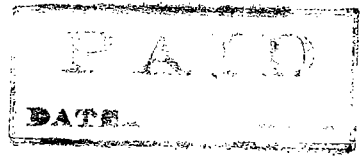



Regarding the application of Ellery Husted for reinstatement of his membership, Mr. Husted was dropped in December 1943 owing both the Chapter and the Institute for 1942 and 1943 dues.

This is in response to your letter of December 19th, regarding information on Mr. Ellery Husted.

The only information we are at liberty to divulge at this time is that he applied for readmission on June 17, 1960. His application was reviewed by the Washington-Metropolitan Chapter on November 8th and then forwarded to The Institute along with the chapter's unfavorable recommendation. Mr. Husted was informed of this unfavorable action by The Secretary of The Institute on November 14th.

His membership was terminated for non-payment of Washington-Metropolitan Chapter dues in 1952. He is still owing the chapter for 1950 and 1951 dues and was advised of this indebtedness before his new application was submitted this summer.

The results of investigation of his registration to practice architecture by the Washington-Metropolitan Chapter indicated that he was not registered to practice in any of the states he mentioned on his application (application for registration was not made in the District of Columbia; and his registration in New York State was not current, etc).
