Dear Mr. Honn:

Mr. Joe E. Smay, Secretary-Treasurer of the Oklahoma Chapter, has reported to us his correspondence with you earlier in this year, wherein you have indicated that you do not wish to be considered a member of the Oklahoma Chapter of the A.I.A.

This, in effect, would mean that your corporate membership in The Institute is to be discontinued also, since every corporate member must be assigned to and remain a member of a local chapter in order to maintain such corporate membership.

We are writing to ascertain if you wish to have your resignation as a corporate member given consideration. If so, then you must restore your good standing in the Chapter by payment of past chapter dues.

When chapter dues remain unpaid, a Chapter also has the privilege of recommending that a corporate membership be suspended or terminated for non-payment of such dues. In such cases, The Board of Directors of The Institute is required, under the A.I.A. By-laws, to act in accordance with such recommendation.


