Thank you very much for the confidential information which is just the sort of think we need.



Dear Chago:

When Leon Chatelain and I were in Puerto Rico we discussed the idea of regarding the architects in Puerto Rico, especially the A.I.A. members, somewhat as a chapter of The Institute - to the extent at least that we would send to you all publications, notices, memorands, etceters, that we send to the chapters. In other words, we would make direct distribution to you from The Octagon rather than having matters channeled through the New York office. It is quite apparent that it would not be feasible for the New York Chapter office to do this.

Because of the expediency with which we have tried to handle this case, I am sure that we have probably missed complying with some of the more formal requisition from the standpoint of presenting of documentation, etc. It is felt, however, that the endorsement of the members of the A.I.A. in Puerto Rico as presented in the afore mentioned minutes of our meeting, and the endorsement of the Puerto Rico Institute of Architects, which not only comprises in its membership the members of the A.I.A. here, but the great majority of the Architects in Puerto Rico, enough force has been placed in the case of Mr. Iglesias by these actions that we hope further substantiation may not be necessary.

service to the profession in general here is acknowledged and Mr. Soler's letter I feel is eloquent evidence of this.



WASHINGTON D.C., May 17, 1966 -- Santiago Iglesias Jr., architect of San Juan, Puerto Rico, was posthumously advanced to Fellowship in The American Institute of Architects. The AIA announced 1966 recipients of the honor today.

Aside from the Gold Medal, which may be presented to a single architect from any part of the world, Fellowship is the highest honor the Institute can bestow on its members.

Iglesias had been a member of the New York Chapter AIA since 1949.

The 60 new Fellows bring the number of Institute members using the letters FAIA after their names to 698, representing only 3.8 percent of the more than 18,000 architects who are corporate AIA members.

Investiture of the new Fellows will take place at the annual banquet and ball Friday, July 1, climaxing the 98th annual convention of the Institute to be held in Denver, Colo., beginning June 26.

A native of Puerto Rico, Iglesias received his bachelor of architecture degree from New York University in 1932 with post graduate work at both Harvard and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

He began his professional architectural career in 1924 in New York City at the Otis Elevator Company, continuing work in New York with various firms until 1932 at which time he was assigned to Puerto Rico by the Department of Interior on its public buildings program. At the time of his death, he was acting chairman of the Puerto Rico Planning Board. He had been a member of the Puerto Rico Planning Board for 26 years.

Iglesias was a personal crusader in the field of higher educational standards in architecture, culminating in the establishment of a school of architecture at the University of Puerto Rico. In addition to his activities for the profession in Puerto Rico, Iglesias extensively participated in international architectural and planning conferences, acting as delegate of the Puerto Rican Planning Board to the Pan American Congress of Architects in 1947, 50, 52 and 55.
