Architect Santiago Iglesias, Jr. A.I.A., our nominee, after graduating from New York University with the degree of Bachelor of Architecture, worked in several architectural offices in New York City. (Please see academic and professional Biographic Sketch attached herewith). After serving to the architectural profession in New York City, he returned to work in Puerto Rico as a public official.

He was appointed Architect in the Department of Public Works, where he served for many years; later served as a Public Service Commission, Architect-Engineer, Assistant-commissioner of Labor and Acting-Commissioner of Labor during the war time.

When the Puerto Rico Planning Board was inaugurated in 1942, he was appointed Member of the same. In his work as Architect-Member of the Planning Board, he has been engaged in matters of public Safety, public health, public welfare, planning in general, civic improvements, creation of parks, play grounds, places of public entertaining, education, the beautification of communities, public highways, reclamation of blighted areas, the six year financial programs of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the restoration and reconstruction of famous historic, cultural and artistic building and sites of Puerto Rico.

He has served in various missions to further architecture and planning around the world. (Please see Sketch Biography). He has been a promoter to establish the School of Architecture of Puerto Rico. He has tried to serve the profession of Architecture in Puerto Rico thru his official position in the Planning Board; he has been instrumental in furthering the Admittance of Architects to the A.I.A. Chapter in New York City.

CENTENNIAL CONVENTION OF THE A.I.A., WASHINGTON, D. C.
MAY 9th TO 19th

WHEREAS during the month of January 1957, President Leon Chatelain, F. A. I. A. and Executive Director, Edmund R. Purves, F. A. I. A. visited the Island of Puerto Rico and on this occasion also paid respects to the Honorable Luis Muñoz Marín, Governor of Puerto Rico.

WHEREAS the aboved named gentlemen representing the A. I. A. and the Governor representing the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico decided that a School of Architecture be established in Puerto Rico.

WHEREAS this action taken by both parties have climaxed so that the Honorable Legislature of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has enacted a bill for such purpose.

WHEREAS all the South American and Central American republics have already established schools of architecture.

WHEREAS the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico is at present one of the countries with the highest university attendance.

WHEREAS the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has already a Planning Board for the last 14 years.

WHEREAS the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico is already prepared to have a School of Architecture.

Be it resolved by this Centennial Convention to send a cordial message to the Honorable Luis Muñoz Marín, Governor of Puerto Rico for having taken interest in the establishment of such school, a message to the Senate of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Speaker of the House and the Chairman of the Committee of Education of the House, and to the Institute of Architects of Puerto Rico, expressing the interest of the Centennial Convention of the A. I. A. in the approval of such a Bill.
