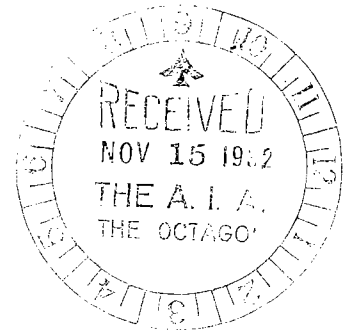

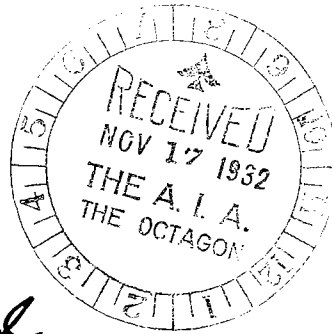



Responding to your inquiry of April 27, 1945, concerning readmission to membership in the Hawaii Chapter of The American Institute of Architects:


