

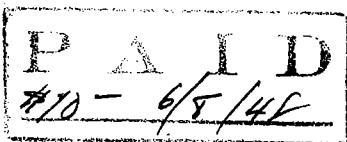

NOTICE OF SUSPENSION OF MEMBERSHIP

It is with much regret that we send to you, and to your chapter secretary, this notice of the suspension of your corporate membership in The Institute, and in its component organizations to which you are assigned—because of nonpayment of Institute dues described as follows: Regular Dues , Supplemental Dues .
