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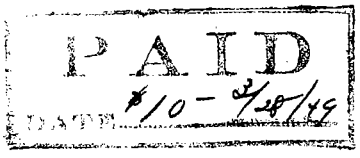



Your letter of August 20th is received, with regard to the possibility of electing Mr. Miller as a Member Emeritus of The Institute.

Enclosed is a formal request for this change in status which customarily is filled in and signed by the member, and you will note it sets forth the conditions under which a member may be eligible.

Mr. Miller has been a member only since 1949; but this period of membership requirement may be waived, as you will note, and if a Chapter so recommends, The Committee on Membership and The Board of The Institute invariably goes along with such recommendation.

If Mr. Miller could qualify under any of the other conditions then it would be entirely feasible to secure his signature to the form and send it along to this office with the Chapter's recommendation that the fifteen years of prior corporate membership be waived.
