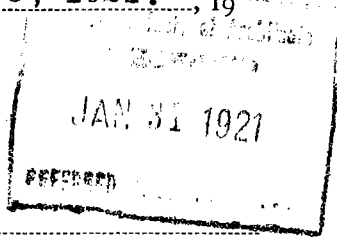



My dear Senator:

The writer was the designing architect for the Washington Radio Station, on Telegraph Road, approximately four and one half (4 1/2) miles South of Alexandria, Va; it will cost, including equipment, approximately \$500,000.00; it consists of nine (9) free standing buildings and will be constructed on a 200 acre farm; and photostatic copies of painted drawings, made by me for this work, of the two (2) main buildings with my credentials are attached.

The above work was done by me while working in the United States Coast Guard, on a salary of \$3600. per annum. After the writer completed the drawings for the above work, the Coast Guard, for reasons not known to me, released me from this appointment.

The contract for the entire construction of this Radio Station has just been awarded, and there is plenty of work for me to do while it is under construction. This work being in Virginia, the State in which the writer has been a legal resident since the date of his birth, and with this in mind, it is asked if you would be kind enough to see if you could have me reappointed as an architect and inspector on the work in question.

It is proper to add that during my service with the Coast Guard, approximately six (6) weeks overtime was put in by me, and not a day's sick leave was taken. The Coast Guard Officers took a great interest in my work and were very friendly with me during all the time while under their direction.

Having had (12) yrs. experience as a mechanic and builder, there is no question as to my being able to give them the best service in the direction of inspection, furthermore, have passed a Civil Service, "Inspector of Construction" examination at a rating of 90. Have been in the U. S. Government Service for approximately sixteen (16) years.
