The package of my exhibits came promptly. Their notice to you must have risen from a bookkeeping error on their part. Thank you very much for sending them.

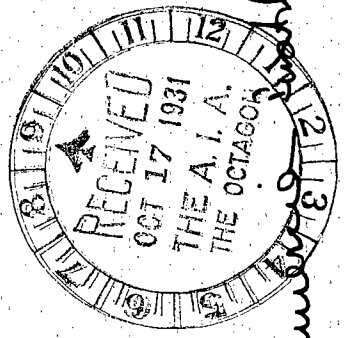
