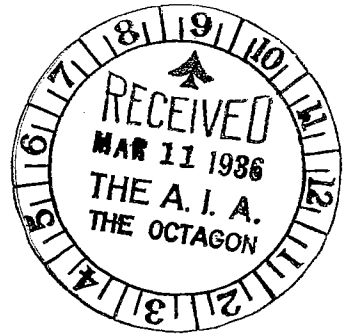

If you look into your records as to my status you will find I believe a record of the date of birth etc., as being May - 15th 1876.

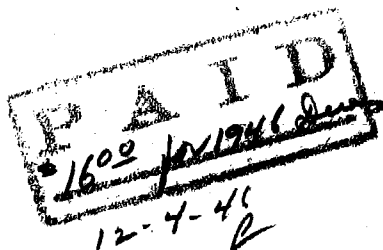
If I am entitled to the consideration above mentioned I would like to take advantage of it.

This is in response to your letter of October 8, concerning the so-called "H" Bonds.

No favorable action has been taken by the House Committee studying tax deferring bonds.

The bills which were introduced in the last session of Congress, regarding this subject, automatically died with the end of the session, and will have to be re-introduced in the new session. We confidently expect, however, that this will be done. We are of the opinion that obtaining favorable action on these bills will be a relatively slow matter, requiring considerable education of the various professional groups involved, and of the congressional committees. We are hopeful that if the idea is kept before the committees, they will eventually see the logic of the proposals and act favorably on them.
