

2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

Mr. Johnson, in the relatively few years that he has practiced architecture in Florida, has greatly influenced the design of buildings throughout the State. He has, through well integrated planning, developed new materials and construction techniques. Local building material suppliers and manufacturers, as well as many from outside of the State of Florida, have sought his advice before developing new products.

The nominee's ability to analyze the basic problems of each project and his knowledge of architectural planning and design have enabled him to design buildings that present the utmost in utility. In doing so he has created many buildings notable for their architectural beauty and utility in various fields, such as education, merchandizing, banking, etc. His thorough study of the problems have in most cases instigated the client to initiate new and better procedures and policies in his business. One example is the Sears, Roebuck and Co.'s Store in Tampa, Florida, which proposed a new concept in stock handling and customer flow that

resulted in more freedom of movement and choice of merchandise, without interference from stock flow.

Another example is the Northside Shopping Center, Miami, Florida, where the truck ramp and unloading areas were placed on the roof, resulting in much lower building costs and easier handling of bulk merchandise.

The design of these buildings, as well as others, is based on an orderly relationship of the structural systems with the layout, and a discriminating use of materials which eliminate the use of ornament and extraneous detail.

The unique but straight forward designs executed by Mr. Johnson have never confused the builders, but have enlightened them and always permitted the job to be completed under the most rigid of financial budgets.

Another example is the Fleet Sonar School, U. S. Naval Station, Key West, Florida, the first of its kind. Its design program included the ability to house top secret training equipment and yet allows inspection of all electrical and mechanical equipment by personnel, who do not have top secret clearance. Also, materials selected had to withstand hurricane force winds, yet this project was constructed at a price well under the U. S. Navy's reduced budget costs.

Each project that Mr. Johnson has undertaken has been studied on its own merits, enabling him to achieve the utmost in utility and in pleasing design results. Although excellence in design has always been his goal, economy has been his watchword.

These three aforesaid examples of the many designs created by this dedicated professional point out some of the many contributions Mr. Johnson has made to the advancement of the architectural profession.

open spaces at a very low cost to the owner. One example of this is the National Airlines Office Building. A similar system was the design for a parking garage in Savannah, Georgia that resulted in the elimination of all shoring and the repetition of parts so that all the steel could be fabricated in jigs. The low bid reflected a cost of \$2.02 per square foot for the structure.

In general, the nominee has created many new materials and methods that have always been slanted toward the construction of better space at lower cost with the use of better and more permanent materials.

Mr. Johnson has always pioneered in the use of new materials particularly in the field of concrete products. The 550 Office Building in Miami, Florida, was possibly the first building in this country that employed the use of precast, prefinished concrete structural wall panels. This building was widely published and was recently published again in England, after ten years. The use of these panels has become widespread and offers theclient an exterior skin wall at a cost far below any of the metal walls.

The nominee has also pioneered the use of unusual and varied structural systems. Two outstanding examples are the Sears, Roebuck and Co.'s Store in Tampa, Florida, and the National Airlines Hangar in Miami, Florida, each of which employed the use of a variation of the folded plate to achieve extremely large spans and cantilevers. The Lehigh Portland Cement Co.'s Administration Building is spanned by an entirely new structural system employing the use of precast shear pins between a flat slab and a strap beam below. Experiments in the use of a combination steel frame and concrete slabs have resulted in the creation of large
