

Dear Bettie:

This is in answer to your letter of August 13th about the following:

Edward D. Gerruti is currently a member. He owes \$75 for 1969.

Irwin M. Johnson's membership was scheduled to be terminated as of 12/31/68, for nonpayment of 1968 dues. We wrote to him on December 30, 1968, and on February 24, 1969, knowing he was eligible for Membership Emeritus, as to whether he would want to be one. He never answered so in May I informed our accounting departmne that it would be all right to go ahead and terminate his membership. (Prior to that I asked that the matter be postponed awhile.) Accounting did in fact remove his name from our rolls but forgot to send out the notice of termination. I just found out about this slipup when checking on your letter. What this means is Mr. Johnson by rights should not be a member because of his indebtedness for 1968. However, since no one was notified that he is not a member, our removal of his name from our rolls cannot be considered official or valid. Bettie, would you find out for me if he wants to be an emeritus member? If so, we can waive his 1968 dues, particularly since he was eligible then, and elect him. Otherwise, we'll have to send out the final notice of termination. Please let me hear from you on this.

Leon K. Rimov's membership terminated 12/31/68 for nonpayment of 1968 dues. In order to reinstate him, we will need from him \$135.00 and have so informed him. He did indicate in February that he wanted to remain in the AIA but he hasn't followed through by sending us the dues and fee.
