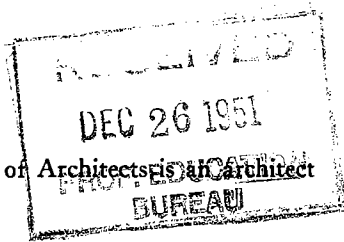

Your letter of the 24th relative to the listing in the telephone book is at hand.

There would be nothing as far as we can see to prevent the initials A.I.A. from following your name in the telephone listing as the privilege of using the initials by a corporate member of The Institute is a right which no one can deny as long as the individual is a corporate member in good standing. 

In response to your letter of April 13:

1. We are processing the transfer, and you will be advised as soon as it is complete.
2. As you will see from the enclosed information on the filing of charges of unprofessional conduct, you may initiate them directly, or furnish information to a chapter and request that chapter to take the action which it may or may not do, as it wishes. Where one has been personally injured, it is usual that the complaint be filed personally. When the action complained of is general in nature (as in an offense such as advertising), then it would seem that the chapter would be interested in pursuing the charges.
3. All material relating to a case is privileged and confidential, except the findings of The Board and its resultant action. In the case referred to, this privilege was waived, and the rather complete text of the case was published at the request of four of the defendants, with the approval of the fifth. No additional information can be made available.





Dear Mr. Johnson:

On behalf of the Secretary, I am writing to let you know that we have received your letter of November 24th wherein you file charges of alleged unprofessional conduct against Messrs. Kiff, Voss, Colean and Souder individually and as a firm operating under the name of York and Sawyer; and against Carl Larson, chief architect of the State of New York. We shall appreciate further information concerning Mr. Larson in order that we may be certain that he is a corporate member of the Institute. We have a member by the name of Carl W. Larson, 16 Chestnut Hill South, Loudonville, N.Y. who is a member of the Eastern New York Chapter. Is this the same Carl Larson to whom you refer as chief architect of the State of New York?

You also mention that you are bringing charges against "any members of his staff". This is not sufficiently specific as charges must indicate by name all members of the Institute who are accused of unprofessional conduct. If upon investigation you find members of Mr. Larson's staff who are corporate members of the A.I.A., you should include them and send us a supplementary letter listing them and, of course, the particular paragraphs of the Mandatory Standards alleged to have been violated.

I believe you are familiar with the procedure after charges are filed. This office, on behalf of the Secretary, forwards the charges to the local Regional Judiciary Committee for

consideration and hearing. The present personnel of the New York Regional Judiciary Committee will change as of January 1, 1962. The term of service of the present Chairman will end on December 31, 1961 and a new Chairman will assume the duties on January 1, 1962. In view of this situation, we hope that you will approve of holding your charges until after January 1st in order that they may be placed before the new 1962 Committee.
