Dear Maurice:

I notice in today's mail an application for corporate membership in the American Institute of Architects by Alfred S. Joseph, Jr. It is my opinion that some hesitation and thought should be given the matter of admitting Mr. Joseph.

It will be remembered that the corporate membership of Alfred S. Joseph, Sr. was terminated on 19 January 1918 when he was proven guilty of unprofessional conduct. While I emphatically do not believe in visiting the sins of the fathers upon the sons, I do believe that if the son is a member of the firm of Joseph & Joseph, that he is, to a certain extent, responsible for the recent professional conduct of this firm.

It is my belief that the firm of Joseph & Joseph have not acted in a strictly professional manner for some years, if ever. And, in addition, I personally know that members of the firm have conducted themselves in a discourteous and unmannerly fashion.

While I realize that it is desirable to have the membership of the Institute as inclusive as possible, I do not think that it is possible to divorce an individual member of a firm from the firm's general conduct. At the very least a strict understanding should be had with this applicant as to the future conduct of his firm before he is admitted. Among other things, this understanding should include fee cutting.

The application of Mr. Alfred S. Joseph, Jr., was approved by The Board of Examiners and recommended for election.


In considering the application, The Board of Examiners had before it copy of the privileged communication of Mr. Stratton O. Hammon, A.I.A., addressed to the Secretary of the Kentucky Chapter, which Mr. Hammon had sent to The Institute.

The Board believes that a communication should be sent to the Kentucky Chapter, advising of the approval of Mr. Joseph's application, somewhat along the following lines:

NOTICE OF ACTION BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In re: Charge of Unprofessional Conduct

Dear Mr. Joseph:

Please be advised that at a duly held meeting of The Board of Directors of The American Institute of Architects, at which a quorum was at all times present, and notice of which meeting was duly waived by you for purposes of hearing the charge against you of unprofessional conduct, the said Board of Directors, by vote of not less than two-thirds of the entire membership of said Board, found you guilty of the charge of actions detrimental to the best interests of the profession through infraction of Rule #12 of the mandatory Standards of Professional Practice; and further

By a vote of like number of said Board of Directors, your corporate membership in The American Institute of Architects and the West Kentucky Chapter to which you are assigned has been suspended for a period of one (1) year from the date of the action by the said Board of Directors - March 29, 1955.

In this latter connection, your attention is called to Chapter XV, Article 1, Section 2, paragraph (c) of the By-laws of The Institute, whereby "upon the suspension of a corporate member his right to act as a delegate to any meeting of The Institute, to sign any petition nominating a member to any office therein or to vote or hold office in The Institute and in any of its chapters or state organizations shall be withdrawn until he is restored to good standing."

Further, The Board of Directors has adopted the following rules with respect to members under suspension:

1. They shall not use the initials "A.I.A."
2. They shall not hold themselves out to the public as members of The Institute.
3. The Institute shall not classify them as members.
4. They shall be removed from the mailing list of The Institute for the period of their suspensions.
5. They will be required to pay dues.
6. They shall not be allowed to attend meetings or participate in any way in Institute activities.

HEARINGS ON MATTERS OF UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT (cont'd)

Ossian P. Ward, A.I.A., vs. Alfred Joseph, Jr., A.I.A.

The defendant was charged with having inserted a paid advertisement in the Louisville Courier-Journal of Sunday, June 20, 1954, on a special page of advertisements pertaining to a new plant for the The Marley Company in Louisville, Kentucky. Mr. Joseph defended himself before the Chapter's Executive Committee on the basis of the establishment of a precedent by other local architects who had, he claimed, inserted similar ads in previous years.

After hearing the evidence in the case, the following actions were taken by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the entire membership of The Board of Directors:

RESOLVED, That Alfred Joseph, Jr. be and hereby is found guilty of having violated Mandatory Rule No. 12 of the Standards of Professional Practice, as above noted; and be it further

Dear Ned:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of December 8, 1955 enclosing a printer's proof of the names, addresses and firm affiliation of each member of our Chapter.

I note that a line has been drawn through the names of Webster Gazlay and Alfred Joseph, Jr., indicating that they are no longer members of the Institute. The membership of Mr. Gazlay has definitely terminated,, but Alfred Joseph, Jr. was suspended in March 29, 1955 for a period of one year. As he has paid his Institute dues for 1955, I assume that he is still a member and that he intends to continue his membership in the Institute.

Mr. Joseph has not paid his annual dues to the Chapter for the year 1955 amounting to \$12.00 and an assessment of \$5.00 imposed on the Corporate membership to help defray expenses of the Great Lakes Regional Conference in Louisville on April 29-30, 1955. He claims that he is exempt from paying Chapter dues while under suspension. Our Chapter By-Laws contain the following provision:

INDIVIDUAL REMISSION OF ANNUAL DUES

The Executive Committee, by the concurring vote of all or of all but one of its members, may, in exceptional instances and under exceptional circumstances and for what it deems adequate cause, remit the annual dues for any member, associate, or junior associate in whole or in part for any year, and such remission may be made retroactive.

This would seem to indicate that the Executive Committee may forgive Mr. Joseph his debt to the Chapter for his year of suspension. The By-Laws only mentions suspension for default of dues. Nothing is said of suspension for violation of mandatory rules. President Bickel concurs in Mr. Joseph's opinion that our By-Laws apply to suspension for default of payment of dues only. Now, I am not insisting that Mr. Joseph pay his Chapter dues, but I would like to have your opinion as to whether he is exempt from payment on account of suspension not being for default.

I personally am quite willing to remit his obligation, but I would like to have your opinion as to whether Mr. Joseph's and Mr. Bickels' opinions are correct. In order to clarify Mr. Joseph's argument of reasoning, I am enclosing a copy of his letter herein.

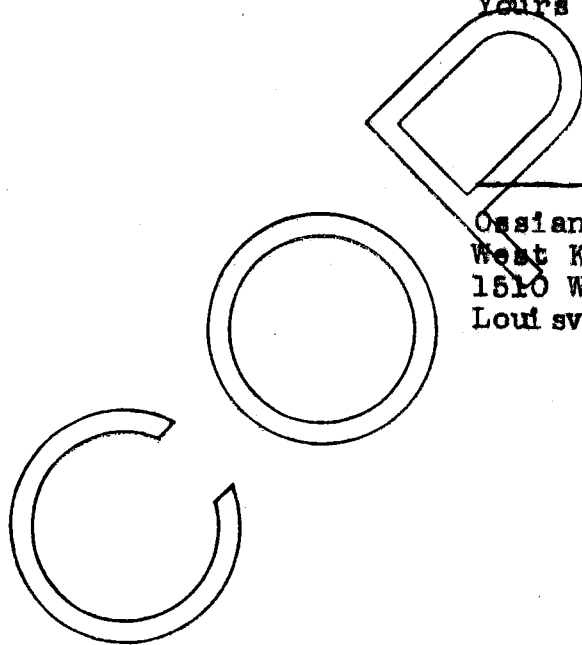


