Dana B. Johannes Dies; Ex-Area Architect

ie July 7, 1972

Dana B. Johannes, 61, a former partner in a Silver Spring architectural firm, died Friday in Clearwater, Fla., after a heart attack. He had been in private practice there since 1963.

Mr. Johannes and Loren L. Murray formed the firm in Silver Spring in 1945. From 1958 to 1963 Mr. Johannes was the partner in charge of the Clearwater office of Johannes and Murray & Associates.

Mr. Johannes helped organize and was the first president of the Maryland Potomac Valley Chapter of the American Institute of Architects and later was president of the Florida Central Chapter of the AIA. He also had been a vestryman at Grace Episcopal Church and a member of the volunteer fire department when living in Silver Spring.

He was born in Washington and began his professional career here in 1933.

Of some 350 school projects designed by Johannes and Murray, Mr. Johannes was instrumental in the design of about 200, many of which received local and national awards and citations for design.

Included in the firm's projects were the Charles W. Woodward, Albert Einstein and Springbrook high schools in Montgomery County, buildings at the University of Maryland and on military in-

stallations, and many churches.

In Florida, Mr. Johannes' practice included churches, schools, motels, commercial buildings and retirement projects.

He leaves his wife, Betty H.; two daughters, Mrs. Aimee Lou Robert and Mrs. Yvonne Perry, and three sons, Dana B., Jan H., and Richard.

Services were held today in Clearwater. The family requests that expressions of sympathy be in the form of contributions to the Dana B. Johannes Memorial Fund, Grace Episcopal Church, 1607 Grace Church Road, Silver Spring, Md.
