Contractors may claim refund of improperly assessed taxes

Construction contractors may claim refunds for taxes which were imposed on meals and lodging furnished to employees for the convenience of the employer thanks to a new ruling by the Internal Revenue Service, the Associated General Contractors of America reports.

Also, a new IRS procedure has been established which sets up steps by which contractors and employees may claim their over-withheld amounts.

Contractors who furnished meals and/or lodging at remote job sites are expected to be the principal beneficiaries of the refund program in the construction industry.

The new ruling by IRS results from the U. S. Supreme Court decision in the Rowan Case which invalidated Dept. of regulations dating back to 1940 s. These regulations had required that "wages" used to determine social security (FICA) and unemployment (FUTA) taxes include the value of meals and/or lodging furnished to employees for the convenience of the employer. But because these taxes were not included as wages for income tax withholding purposes by IRS, the Supreme Court determined that they could not be included as wages for social security and unemployment tax purposes.

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
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
