## Arthur L. Jones

Arthur Laidler Jones, 64, died December 17 at St. Luke's Hospital in Tryon. He was born April 23rd, 1897 in Charleston, S. C., the son of the late Arthur Laidler Jones and Elizabeth Warren Smith Jones.

He attended the public schools of Charleston, the College of Charleston and was graduated with a B. S. in Architecture at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1922.

In 1924 he moved to South Florida and lived at various times in Miami, Palm Beach and Coconut Grove, before taking up his residence in Tryon, North Carolina in 1941.

During World War I he was a Naval Aviator and in World War II held the position of Chairman of the Red Cross for Polk County. Mr. Jones was a former member of the Carolina Yacht Club, and the St. Cecilia Society of Charleston, the Surf Club of Miami Beach, the Tryon Riding and Hunt Club, and the Country Club of Tryon, and for several years was Secretary and Treasurer of the Tryon Rotary Club. At the time of his death he was a member of the American Institute of Architects, the Piedmont Club of Spartanburg, and the Poinsett Club of Greenville.

Mr. Jones was a Unitarian, and at one time was Chairman of the Vestry of the Unitarian Church of Charleston, as well as a Founder Member of the

church in Miami, Florida. After moving to Tryon he became interested in the Episcopal Church, and served a term on the Vestry of the Episcopal Church of the Holy Cross.

He is survived by his widow, the former Mrs. Margaret Law Ellertson, and one son, Arthur Laidler Jones III.

At the request of the deceased the remains will be cremated, and the ashes scattered, and there will be no service.
