The Architects' Roster is maintained by The American Institute of Architects as a service to the profession as a whole and to agencies of the United States Government. Growing out of an earlier Register of architects qualified for public works, The Roster provides at The Octagon an accurate, current record of the qualifications and achievements of members of the profession. It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.

5 REMARKS CONCERNING QUALIFICATIONS OF FIRM

Overseas war experience as Construction Officer on the Staff of the Commander Aircraft South Pacific included the design and supervision of construction of the Commands shore establishment. This comprised Control Tower, barracks, mess halls, roads and all facilities for 1,000 officers and men. As Design Superintendent in the Public Works Dept. for the Navy I had charge of an office which designed and prepared plans and specifications for all construction work at U.S. Naval Air Station, Brunswick, Maine, and five outlying fields. This included hangers, runways, airport lighting, control towers, rocket and other target ranges, barracks ordnance facilities and housing. Approximate cost \$3,000,000.00.

In 1946-47, in addition to private practise I acted as Chief Architect for the N. J. Public Housing & Development Authority in connection with the forty-one million dollar State Veterans Housing Program. I was subsequently retained as Architect by eight municipalities to design and supervise the construction of permanent housing totalling five hundred and fifty-two units at a cost of \$3,311,850.00.

We have recently done considerable school work - both public and private - as well as maintaining a general practise which includes municipal, residential and commercial jobs.
