


Dear Mr. Nes,

Dear Miss Alex:

President Nes gave me your letter of March 5th and asked me to reply, since it is my responsibility to see to it that the work done at the Octagon is all right.

I can't blame you for criticizing us for overlooking such a basic personal matter as whether you are male or female.

We got your application and the Chapter's recommendation from our membership files and, by golly, there is nothing anywhere on the forms, including those you filled out yourself, which gives any clue to this except your first name "Iris." The Chapter form has a place where it says, "Whereas, (name of applicant) an architect having his legal residence, etc.etc..." Some chapters take the trouble to cross out the word "his" and substitute the word "her" when the applicant is a woman. This wasn't done on the form of recommendation for you. I have to assume that our people were not sure that the first name "Iris" was not the name of a man. I have known one Iris in my lifetime - a most feminine young actress, - but no men by that name at all.

Wont you please just agree that this is something that can happen to us when we are running a business involving 19,000 people and accept my apologies for the mistake.
