A. S. Alschuler. of Technology and the Art institute of Chicago. He began his work in the office of Dankmar Adler in 1899 and opened his own office eight years later. He was the first architect to use reinforced concrete construction in Chicago, and he contributed several innovations to the field of architecture. Among the large industrial plants he designed are those of the Cuneo Press, John Sexton company, the American Radiator company, and A. B. Dick com-

He designed many downtown Chicago buildings, among them the London Guarantee and Accident building, the Harvester building, the Chicago Garment center, and the Mercantile Exchange building. His synagogues, the Sinai congregation, Temple Isaiah Israel, and the North Shore congregation, are known as among the most beautiful in the country.
