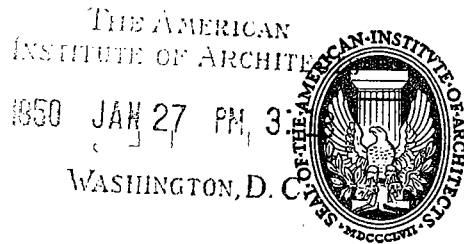

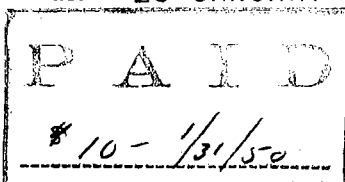



Gentlemen: I have been moderately inactive for three or four years and allowed my membership to terminate after having been a member since about 1950-51.


It is my understanding, I must pay up all back dues to restore my full and active membership. Am I correct.

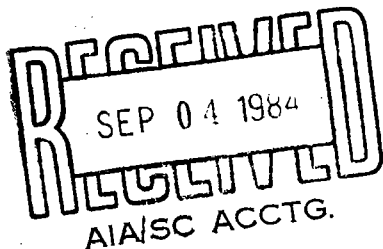




