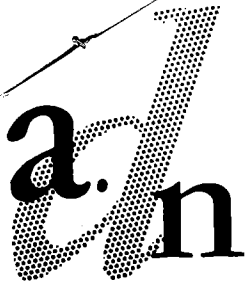

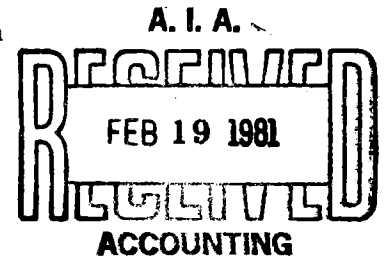
Mr. Armet is seriously ill and it will be some time before he is able to conduct his architectural practice, if at all.

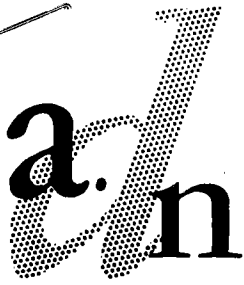
