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DIGEST OF THE CAREER AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF

RICHARD M. ARNOLD
PHOENIX, ARIZONA

Design

The Nominee has participated in numerous important works in the area of his practice, and has become known among his peers as a source of significant architecture for this locale. Such projects include Phoenix Municipal Stadium, Tempe Sands Motel, Arizona Public Service Company's Deer Valley Facility, Center for Planetary Research at Lowell Observatory in Flagstaff, Colonia Miramonte in Paradise Valley, the Arts and Architecture Complex at Arizona State University, Master Planning and Library for Thunderbird Graduate School for International Management, the Sun City office of Western Savings & Loan Association, a major parking structure for First National Bank of Arizona, and Trevor Browne High School in Phoenix.

Service to
the
Profession

During production of the above-named works, the Nominee was deeply involved in Central Arizona Chapter activities with the State Legislature regarding the Arizona Society of Architects. In 1961 he volunteered to help rectify statutory limits on compensation to architects for services on public works in Arizona. A long-standing interest in contractual arrangements for architectural services was thus channeled into active concern for a Statewide problem for Arizona architects.

Four years' effort produced an important revision in the Statutes, which enabled Architects to negotiate for higher fees and additional services, and resulted in the adoption, through the State's Attorney General's Office, of a uniform agreement modeled on the AIA's B-131 form. Important advances were achieved in both basic compensation provisions and those for additional services, as well as greatly improving the entire contractual arrangements between public agencies and the architects.

He has spearheaded continuing efforts by the State Society in developing a revised fee schedule and legislative revisions affecting the statutory limits on fees, plus efforts to obtain a statute of limitations on professional liability, lien provisions for architects, County building code enabling acts and workable billboard controls.

After serving as Chapter President in 1968 and President of the Arizona Society of Architects in 1969, he created the Arizona Council of Professions and has served as its founding president for 1970 and 1971. In instituting the Council he placed the Architectural profession in a position of leadership to create a climate of concern and control for the several learned professions in a variety of public and civic responsibility areas. The member professions of lawyers, accountants, engineers, doctors, dentists, optometrists, veterinarians and architects have found a tremendous area of inter-professional common interests and potentials for helping each other and the public through joint effort. His efforts in these several areas of Statewide activity have materially advanced the profession of Architecture in terms of legislative recognition, improved practice conditions and in ability to assert itself collectively in the public sector.

Our profession has become much more vocal and effective in the community than it was in the past as a result of his unstinting personal contribution.
