Dear Miss Woodworth:

In accordance with instructions received from The Secretary of The AIA, we are returning to you, herewith, the Application for Corporate Membership of Mr. John Cabot.

Inasmuch as Mr. Cabot is not currently registered to practise architecture he is not eligible for corporate membership in The AIA. Your attention is invited to Chapter II of the Rules of The Board which reads as follows:

"The following shall be eligible to become corporate members of The Institute:

- "(a) Registered architects in private practice;
- "(b) Registered architects engaged on a salary by the government or a firm, so long as the work being done is architectural rather than in other fields, such as administration or sales;"

Prior to 1960, The Secretary of The Institute had the authority to waive the registration requirement for government employees. By action of The Board of Directors at the San Francisco Convention the provision of the Rules of The Board as set forth above was adopted.

The Secretary advises he will be glad to accept Mr. Cabot's application if the Chapter can find any support of his statement that he is a registered architect; or if and when he becomes registered again.

We will not write to Mr. Cabot advising him of the Secretary's action and refunding to him the dues paid in advance until we receive advice of the Chapter's action or further recommendation concerning Mr. Cabot's application.

In response to your inquiry regarding application of Mr. Cabot, we were previously informed that President Carroll wished to appoint Mr. Cabot on a working commission at the Symposium in Mexico. In this connection Secretary Gamble requested that the Chapter accelerate final action at that level if the application was clear cut and if the Chapter agreed. Although the Chapter sounded cooperative it was not submitted to The AIA for final action until November 7th.

It has now been brought to light that Mr. Cabot is not currently registered to practise architecture and for this reason Mr. Gamble did not approve it when it was presented to him for final action. Consequently the application has been returned to the Chapter for further review and recommendation.

at San Francisco, A.I.A. Document No. 405, page 11, which  
states:

"RESOLVED, That the following shall be eligible  
to become corporate members of The Institute:

- a. Registered architects in private practice;
- b. Registered architects engaged on a salary by  
the Government or a firm, so long as the work  
being done is architectural rather than in  
other fields, such as administration or sales;
- c. Teachers of architecture; editors of architec-  
tural publications."

Insofar as this latest ruling differs from any previous instruc-  
tions it does, of course, take precedence. It is recognized  
that there are still unanswered questions in the matter of  
eligibility, but these will simply have to be taken up, case  
by case, by The Secretary of The Institute.

I have received copies of Mr. Landry's memorandum to Miss Gervais, and Mrs. Marx, dated November 27, 1963, as well as Mrs. Marx's memorandum to Mr. Landry dated December 2, 1963. Some comments from President Carroll seem to be in order.

President Carroll did not wish to "appoint Mr. Cabot on a Working Commission at the Symposium in Mexico." Mr. Cabot was proposed by James Lawrence, Jr., and he was not appointed by President Carroll for the reasons that 1) we had no intention of appointing a member to the so-called Sports Equipment Commission; 2) it had been determined that John Cabot was not a corporate member of the AIA.

I am very glad that Mr. Cabot has made application to become a member of the Institute, although I see no reason why he should not be a registered architect. However, this matter is properly in the domain of our honorable Secretary Gamble.

Even though Mr. John Cabot does become a member of the Institute, the recommendation for his appointment to the Commission on Sports Equipment of UIA, should not be considered automatic. Whether we shall, or shall not recommend an appointment to the Commission has yet to be determined. If the decision is to appoint a representative, I am sure that a number of candidates will be considered for that position.

You have asked us to confirm our discussion on the subject, principally to advise Clint Gamble by copy of this memo. Let's for a moment divorce the question of John Cabot's application from the UIA Sports Equipment Commission. Your memorandum of December 10th disposes of the UIA problem adequately. Bill Scheich's memo of December 10th contributes additional information on that subject. (See attached).

Although the Public Services Department has no responsibility whatever in membership applications, the local chapter contacted John Dawson concerning Cabot's application. The Institute has two contacts with Cabot. One is the NARS Program in his capacity as Chief Architect of the National Park Service and two in terms of our governmental liaison program. It was in the latter relationship that John Dawson was contacted by the local chapter. They seemed to have gotten their nose a bit "out of joint" because the Institute had requested expeditious handling of his application when he had been proposed as a representative to the UIA Commission and then rejected because he had allowed his license to lapse.

When John Dawson advised us of the chapter contact, I wrote the enclosed memorandum to Flo Gervais and Maureen Marx dated November 17th. I did not know until your memorandum of December 10th that James Lawrence and not you had fostered Cabot's candidacy for appointment to the UIA Working Commission.

In recent conversation with the local chapter, I feel sure that they are aware that Clint Gamble's action was completely in order and that the next step is for Cabot to reinstate his license. I also surmise that the local chapter has a strong feeling that Cabot should be processed as a member and gathered that they would take some extra pains in helping him get his license reinstated in either Minnesota or Massachusetts.

January 6, 1964

From the point of view of the Public Services Department we should withdraw responsibility completely and further developments would be handled through Maureen Marx who has the basic responsibility in this matter.

In closing, however, I think it goes without saying that this Department's responsibility in government liaison would be enhanced with the Department of the Interior if Cabot can overcome his licensing problem and become processed as a corporate member. He is the Chief Architect supervising the work of between 250 and 300 architects in the National Park Service. He attended Dartmouth College for two years, got a B. Arch. at Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1933 and studied at the Ecole de Beaux Art in Fontainebleau, 1933-34. He has worked for Roscoe Dewitt, Norman Bell Geddes, and practiced privately in Denver and Boston. He has held responsible positions with the National Park Service over a period of 15 years in New Mexico, Nebraska, Pennsylvania and as Chief Architect here in Washington since 1961. I have noticed that Cabot's registration in Minnesota in 1934 was on the basis of his architectural degree and experience without examination. He has not renewed in that state since 1936. He may very well get caught in the situation of having to take a written examination which, of course, may be difficult for a 34 year old man who has been away from private practice for 15 years. I think we will just have to wait and see on that score.
