From June 1923 to Dec. 1946 I worked as instructor of Industrial Arts appointed as Continuation Teacher with the Department of Education in the public schools of Puerto Rico.

During this time and in short sections in the evening, I taught carpentry and blue print reading to grown persons engaged in this ocupation. Those courses were stablish under the direction of the Department for Vocational Ocupation.

In 1923 I began to study a course in Givil Engineering with the International Correspondence Schools of Scranton, Pa.
At this time I start to work in projects for constructtion of residential houses and in relation with architectural work.

I attended about seven summer courses for industrial arts teachers icluding mechanical and architectural drawing at the University of Puerto Rico at Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico.

In January 26, 1928, I obtained the Surveying License No. 515 issued by the Board of Examiners of Engineer, Architects and Surveyors of Puerto Rico.

In November 7th, 1946I obtained the License of Architetec N°. 1710 issued by the Board of Examiners of Engineers, Architec and Surveyorat of Puerto Rico.

At this time I resigned as Instructor of Industrial Arts with the Department of Education and Start by my own account in architectural work.

From the year 1948 to 1952 the Department of Vocational Education establish the Drafting Course in the Vocational School and I was appointed Instructor in Architectural Drawing. I work during four years.
