

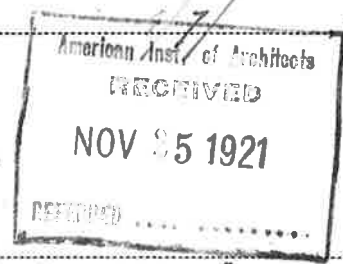

Dear Mr. Campau:

With regard to your pending resignation from the Institute, and the Grand Rapids Chapter, I take the liberty of writing somewhat informally.

It is quite apparent from correspondence which has come in to The Octagon that you are the only one who contemplates your resignation with anything but regret and dissatisfaction.

Our Regional Director for the Great Lakes Division, Frederick W. Garber, in Cincinnati, is much concerned. He advises me that he has written to you and that the Chapter and the Institute cannot afford to lose your membership.

I do not know just what the difficulty is, and perhaps should not inquire.

I do hope that no lack of attention on any occasion on the part of this office has caused you to be dissatisfied with the Institute. And I also hope if there is some moot point or some unsatisfactory condition which is troubling you that you will write to me frankly and give me an opportunity, on behalf of the Institute, to explain or comment.

The Institute needs the moral support of the better men in the architectural profession. It needs that support at all times, but more than ever at present.

Your resignation will come up at the Executive meeting - about the middle of February. In the meantime, I would appreciate it if you would write me frankly.

Dear Mr. Mead:

This is the first opportunity to respond to your letter of December 10th, received on the 13th.

We find that the memberships of Messrs. Charles A. Crowe and Antoine B. Campan terminated on December 31, 1935, for the non-payment of Institute dues. Both of them owe for dues for the period of 1931 to 1935, inclusive in the amount of \$55.00.

When so recommended by chapters, The Board of Directors usually cooperates in bringing former members back into The Institute by remitting their back dues, subject to their application for readmission, similar action by the chapters with respect to chapter dues, and the payment of \$25.00 for the admission fee and one year's institute dues in advance.

The next meeting of The Board, so far as we know at present, will be held the latter part of April in Indianapolis, just preceding the annual meeting of The Institute there. The semi-annual meeting was held recently, on December 1, 2, and 3, in Memphis.

If the Grand Rapids Chapter wishes to submit requests for remission of the back dues of Messrs. Crowe and Campan, and you will send in recommendations to that effect, we will see that the matter goes before The Board when it meets again.
