



Dear Mr. Hurt:

I have just learned, with regret, that you are considering the relinquishment of your corporate membership in the Institute and are planning to drop back to the Associate classification for the duration. I am writing to you regarding this for several reasons. In the first place, many men drop out of the Institute because they not only will have to close their offices but they will be unable to secure employment in their own district and because of family and other reasons will not be able to go to other places such as Washington and receive the advantages of Government employment. The depleted membership may make it impossible for the Institute to carry on the work which it is attempting for the profession and we need every corporate member who can possibly secure employment or commissions and who could squeeze out enough from his income to maintain his corporate standing.

I am aware of your active and excellent service in your chapter and I regret to see you drop your standing because for the time being you cannot continue your active participation in chapter affairs. The Institute will continue its work for the good of the profession during the war as well as previously, and will need to have the membership continue its affiliation and support of the Institute during the same period.

Dear Mr. Weaver:

Please accept my sincere apologies for having apparently ignored your letter of 1/22 to me. I did not intend the discourtesy. Nor can I account for it except that somehow your letter found its way into the file and my "tomorrow" never came. I am sorry indeed and I hope that you will be lenient in your judgment.

I was reminded of the letter by Mr. Kemper's of 3/30 to me, of which I note you have a copy. I wish that I could continue my membership in the Institute, unbroken. But, like the many others you mentioned, I have had to close my office and leave my home community, and like many of those others, I do not now know when it will be possible to return to that community and to practice. Mrs. Hurt and I completed and moved into our new home only about six weeks before I came to Norfolk and the Naval Base work, and since I must be away from Waynesboro I have resigned from all other organizations for the duration. I felt that I should do this so that the Virginia Chapter, the Virginia Society of Architects, and one or two Waynesboro organizations would have less dead-wood and so they could elect some one who can take an active part in all activities. Then too, since I am forced into this thing of defense work I have decided to go all out in the defense of that new house.

For the present I do not believe I can reconsider my resignation. The Institute will have my continued interest and when we are again back on some kind of even keel I shall ask for a reinstatement. In the mean time, I have made application for a commission in the U.S. Navy (Reserve), and if accepted, the appointment will mean some further financial sacrifice as well as unknown changes in personal plans and duty status.

DUES FOR 1942

1. The Board of Directors has fixed the annual dues for 1942 at \$20.00 per member.
2. Annual dues may be paid in three installments, as follows: \$7.00 on or before March 31, 1942, \$7.00 additional on or before September 1, 1942, and \$6.00 additional on or before December 31, 1942. If each of these installments is paid on or before the time stated, the member will not be in default during the year unless he is under suspension for default of the previous year's dues.
3. On the other hand, a member is in default if one-third of the current year's dues is not paid by said March 31; or if two-thirds thereof is not paid by said September 1; or if the full amount thereof is not paid by said December 31.
4. Every member who has paid his 1941 dues in full but has not paid the entire amount of his 1942 dues on or before December 31, 1942, will be in default for the unpaid amount and *ipso facto* his membership will be suspended on that date.

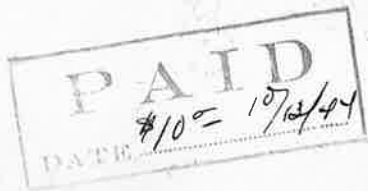





This is in reply to your letter of March 20.

The Institute does not have definite policies on the question of incorporation by architects. This is most often a matter of state law which does not permit professional men to incorporate. However, there are many exceptions to this, such as Michigan, where a large number of firms are incorporated. We regret that we do not know what the law of the State of Virginia says on this subject, but are sure you will be able to ascertain that answer by writing the State Corporation Commissioner.

We might add that the trend is more and more away from incorporation, many states having abandoned the practice of granting permission, which formerly was granted to architects to incorporate.


