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Eugene Mackey are confined principally to his activities in the design of college and university buildings. He has done notable work in the design of buildings which are both functionally effective and aesthetically gratifying, not the least of which is a "Hall of Learning" for Centre College of Kentucky, still in the early working drawing stage. This building, which will combine generous library facilities with seminar classrooms, will constitute a new stage in the design of university teaching facilities for the undergraduate campus. Dr. Harold B. Gores, president of the Educational Facilities Laboratories, Inc., of New York has written me regarding it that "It is the most promising design that has come to our attention. The great feature, as I see it, is that it will expand and contract with the variation in daily load as well as expand through the years as the College grows." This design, still in preliminary phases, illustrates the manner in which Eugene Mackey is continuing to build on the insight into educational needs which has won the Olin Library at Washington University high critical acclaim from academic librarians.
