I will keep in mind the Bldg papers -

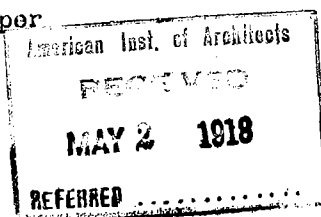
