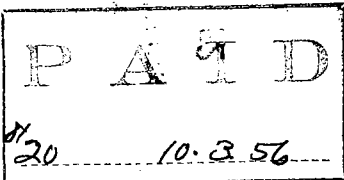

Dear Joe:

In your October issue of the West Texas Chapter "NEWSLETTER", which I received on my return from the TSA Convention in Dallas, I noted an item indicating that Mr. A. M. Martin of Andrews, Texas, has requested transfer to our West Texas Chapter from the Brazos Chapter.

Mr. Martin indicates that he now resides or has a place of business in the City of Andrews which is located in Andrews County. This county, according to the Institute Membership List, is in the Texas Panhandle Chapter's territory.

According to the Institute's By-laws, Chapter II, Article 1, Section 4, Mr. Martin's transfer to our Chapter would have to be acted on by the Institute's Board of Directors after first obtaining the consent of the Texas Panhandle Chapter.

Mr. Martin, when he was a partner in the firm of Caudill, Rowlett, Scott and Associates of Bryan, Texas, did their structural engineering, was listed by them in their literature as an engineer, and was in charge of the supervision of their projects at the time I was associated with the firm on a local school job. Mr. Bill Caudill informed me that Mr. Martin performed engineering services for other architectural firms, which led to Mr. Martin leaving the firm.

In view of the fact that the Institute ruled recently that we could not have engineers as associate members in our Chapter, I am not in favor of having an engineer as a corporate member even though he has by some means obtained an architect's license and thereby membership in the Institute.
