#### Joseph Maybank, FAIA 1930 - 1992

Joseph Maybank, Cambridge architect and a founding principal and president of Architectural Resources Cambridge, Inc., died on September 4 at his home in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Joseph Maybank was born October 8, 1930, in Charleston, South Carolina, the son of Joseph Maybank and Jane Harrison (Peltzer) King. He attended St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire, and was graduated from Harvard College in 1953. He served as a first lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps from 1953 to 1955.

Inspired to become an architect while at Harvard, then a leading center for architecture because of the presence of Walter Gropius and other former members of the Bauhaus school, Maybank went on to study architecture at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he received the Willard D. Perkins Traveling Prize. After graduating from MIT in 1958 he joined The Architect's Collaborative in Cambridge, MA where he worked until 1966 when he joined Benjamin Thompson Associates, also of Cambridge. In 1969 he became a founding partner of Architectural Resources Cambridge, Inc., where he was a principal until his death.

Known in particular for the design of the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, and for projects at Tufts University, Duke University, Northfield Mount Hermon School, Genzyme Corporation, and other schools, universities, and corporations across the United States, Mr. Maybank was a fellow of the American Institute of Architects, which awarded his firm its Honor Award in 1981. The firm also received numerous other professional awards and honors, including the Boston Society of Architects Award for Excellence in 1981 and 1987.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Rose Ferguson Maybank, whom he married in 1961, and three sons, Joseph Maybank of New York City; Bayard R. Maybank of Los Angeles; and Alexander H.F. Maybank of New York City.
