WILLIAM L. MAYNE

William L. Mayne, prominent Washington area architect, died late Wednesday evening, September 20, at Jefferson Memorial Hospital, Alexandria, Virginia as a result of injuries sustained from a fall that afternoon, from a building at 5714 Columbia Pike, Baileys Crossroads, Virginia. Mr. Mayne was President of the firm of Mayne, Useroff, Van Besien, Incorporated of Arlington, Virginia.

Born in Emmetsburg, Iowa on March 10, 1920 he was graduated from D. C. Public Schools and received a Bachelor of Architectural Engineering degree cum laude from Catholic University of America in 1942. He served as an architect for the Southern Railway Company from 1946 through 1953. He founded the present partnership in 1963. Mr. Mayne and his firm have been involved in the development of the Rosslyn, Virginia area.

He was a member of the American Institute of Architects, Chairman of the Northern Virginia Section of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter of the AIA, Chairman of the Codes and Zoning Committee of the Northern Virginia Section of the AIA, and a member of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments and on the Board of Directors of the Northern Virginia Builders Association.

Mr. Mayne was a Ruling Elder of the John Calvin Presbyterian Church and Chairman of its Finance Committee. He was elected "Outstanding Layman of the Year" in 1965 by the Washington City Presbytery and was past Chairman of the Nominating Committee of the Washington City Presbytery.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Virginia, a daughter, Linda and three sons, Gary, Gregory and James of Falls Church, Virginia. He is also survived by his mother, Mrs. Rose Christine Mayne, and his sister, Mrs. Marquerite Sithens, of Fairfax County, Virginia and his brother, Lewis Mayne of Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

The funeral service was held Saturday, September 23, at 2 P.M. at the John Calvin Presbyterian Church, Columbia Pike, Annandale, Virginia, with burial at the National Memorial Cemetery, Falls Church, Virginia.

Architect Dies After 10-Foot Fall

A 52-year-old Fairfax County architect died Wednesday, six hours after he fell 10 feet from the top of a hardware store where he was inspecting the roof, county police said yesterday.

William L. Mayne, of the firm Mayne, Oseroff and Van Bosten in Arlington, died at Alexandria's Jefferson Memorial Hospital about 9:30 p.m. of head injuries.

Mayne, who lived at 6225 Edgewater Dr., near Falls Church, was inspecting the roof of Gearhart's Hardware Store at Baileys Crossroads when he slipped and fell to the concrete pavement, police said.

Born in Emmetsburg, Iowa, he received a bachelor of architectural engineering cum laude from Catholic University and served as the architect for the Southern Railway Co. from 1946 to 1953. He founded his present company in 1963.

He was a member of the American Institute of Architects, chairman of the Northern Virginia section of the Washington Metropolitan chapter of the AIA and the Washington Metropolitan Council of Governments. He also served on the board of directors of the Northern Virginia Builders Association.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Virginia; a daughter, Linda; three sons, Gary, Gregory and James of Falls Church; his mother, Rose Mayne; a sister, Marguerite Sithens of Fairfax County, and a brother, Lewis of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

William Mayne, President Of Area Firm of Architects

William L. Mayne, 52, president of the Arlington architectural firm of Mayne, Oseroff, Van Bosten, Inc., died Wednesday in Jefferson Memorial Hospital in Alexandria of injuries received in a fall from a building in the 5700 block of Columbia Pike in Baileys Crossroads. He lived on Edgewater Drive in Falls Church.

Fairfax police said that Mr. Mayne fell about 10 feet from the building for which his firm was planning an addition.

Mr. Mayne was chairman of the Northern Virginia Section of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, chairman of the Northern Virginia Section's codes and zoning committee and a member of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments. He was a director of the Northern Virginia Builders Association.

Mr. Mayne was born in Emmetsburg, Iowa. He attended public schools here and in 1942 received a bachelor of architectural engineering degree cum laude from Catholic University. From 1946 to 1953 he

was an architect for the Southern Railway.

He and his firm, which he founded in 1963, have been active in the development of the Rosslyn area.

A ruling elder of John Calvin Presbyterian Church in Annandale, Mr. Mayne was chairman of its finance committee. In 1965 he was selected as the outstanding layman of the year by the Washington City Presbytery. He was a former chairman of the presbytery's nominating committee.

He leaves his wife, Elizabeth Virginia, a daughter, Linda, and three sons, Gary, Gregory and James; his mother, Mrs. Rose Christine Sithens, both of Fairfax County, and a brother, Lewis, who lives in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

Services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow at John Calvin Church, 6531 Columbia Pike, Annandale, with burial in National Memorial Park in Falls Church. The family requests that expressions of sympathy be in the form of contributions to the memorial fund of the church.

OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO THE CHAPTER

William L. Mayne, AIA (Posthumous)

William L. Mayne, as a member of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, was instrumental in the early formulation of a Northern Virginia Architectural Group. In 1966 'Bill' Mayne became Secretary-Treasurer of the newly formed Northern Virginia Section of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter. In 1968 he moved up to Vice-Chairman of that Section, and in 1970 became Chairman. In September, 1972, he sent out his famous 'distress' letter to the Section's members detailing why the status of a 'Section' was not working. Through his strenuous lobbying efforts, and with a poll of the members indicating approval he worked towards the formulation of a Northern Virginia Chapter of the A.I.A. On September 20, 1972, following a tragic accident at a construction site on one of his project, William Mayne died, never seeing the final realization of his dreams, the formation of the Northern Virginia Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. His work will live on, and we honor him today for these efforts.

Paul H. Barkley, Jr., A.I.A.

Mr. Barkley began his affiliation with the northern Virginia Chapter of A.I.A. as a member of the Northern Virginia Section of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter. He has unceasingly given of his time to help the Chapter achieve its present stature in Virginia. To this end he has been one of the Chapter's foremost representatives in the Virginia State Society of Architects, having served as the State Society's Commissioner of Society Affairs while representing the Northern Virginia Chapter, on the Public Relations Committee, the Budget and Finance Committee, and presently holds the position of Treasurer. In his community Mr. Barkley has been awarded the "Pillar of the Community" award from the Greater Falls Church Chamber of Commerce. His residence and garden design was recognized for excellence by an award from the Falls Church Village Preservation & Improvement Society. He has become the Chapter's unofficial Public Relations expert photographing and seeing that information gets published in local media publications on the Northern Virginia Chapter. Mr. Barkley is truly a "man for all seasons" and it is appropriate that he be recognized at this time.

Douglas S. Denny, A.I.A.

Doug Denny joined the AIA in August 1974 as a member of the Northern Virginia Section of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter. He was a charter member of the Northern Virginia Chapter in 1975, and served the Board of Directors from 1976 to 1978. He was Chapter Treasurer in 1978; membership chairman in 1979, and served on the Virginia Society Budget and finance committee. During his time in office, and while serving on the Board of Directors he organized and administered the First Northern Virginia Architect's Homes tour in 1976 and was organizational chairman for the Virginia Society AIA fall meeting in 1977. He has chaired the committee for by-laws revisions, and has represented the Chapter as a delegate to the AIA National convention. Doug currently represents the Northern Virginia Chapter as delegate to the Mid-Atlantic Regional Council. Throughout all his activities Doug has been helpful, hard working, and steadfast, and deserves Chapter recognition.
