



Dear Mr. McAdoo:

We are pleased to receive your letter of June 6 indicating your wish to be readmitted.

Your membership was terminated for not reporting that you were not liable for 1966 supplemental dues.

Recognizing that the matter has caused much confusion:
among the members and chapters, the Secretary has agreed
to waive the readmission fees (\$10) of people whose
memberships terminated as of December 31st for not reporting

of course, that they do apply for reinstatement within a
