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A member, by virtue of his membership in The Institute, becomes a member of the chapter of The Institute within the territory of which he resides or has his place of business, as he elects, but he pays an admission fee to The Institute only. The admission fee to membership in The Institute normally is twenty-five dollars. (For 1936 this fee was reduced to five dollars.)

A member pays annual dues both to The Institute and to the chapter. The annual dues to The Institute normally are twenty-five dollars (for 1936 Institute dues were reduced to twenty dollars) and those to the chapter are fixed in its by-laws.

Normally the period between the time of filing

an application and the time it is acted on by The Board of The Institute is four months. The period will be longer if the application must be returned to the applicant for corrections or if additional exhibits of the applicant's work are required by The Board of Examiners.

If an application is denied, the amount prepaid by the applicant for annual dues and for admission fee, less five dollars for examination fee, will be returned to him.

An applicant whose application has been denied without prejudice may reapply for admission to membership a year or more after the date of The Secretary's notice to him of his non-admission.

My dear Col. McCarty:

Beginning with July 1, 1942, dues of members of The Institute who are in military service may be waived for the duration of the war - upon request of such members, and upon approval of their Chapters.

According to the record here you are indebted for Institute dues for 1941, 1942 and 1943 in the sum of \$60.00 - and in addition dues for 1944 are now payable. Of this total of \$80.00 the sum of \$50.00 may be waived, upon payment of \$30.00 to cover the year 1941 and the first half of 1942, and upon approval of your Chapter.

A majority of the members in military service have requested waiver of dues. Others have preferred to pay them.

We have not heard from you in this matter and therefore take the liberty of writing this letter to ascertain your wishes.

A circular concerning waiver of dues is enclosed.

If conditions make letter writing difficult, your reply in the margin of this letter or on the back of it, sent in the enclosed envelope, would be entirely satisfactory.

My dear Colonel McCarty:

The enclosed marked reprint shows the policy of The Institute with respect to national dues of those of its members in uniform.

As you will note, the waiver of dues is not automatic. Before action can be taken here we must have a request from the member concerned, and the approval of his chapter - which we get by communication with the chapter.

Those members who have not requested waivers have received statements for dues from time to time; and some of them under normal procedure would be in line for suspension for non-payment.

But The Board directed that no member in military service be suspended, and that his membership be held in abeyance until his return to civilian life and until he had had opportunity to give attention to the matter.

According to the record here, you are indebted for \$100.00 for Institute dues for the years 1941-42-43-44-45 and have not requested a waiver.

The purpose of this is to suggest that you now request a waiver if you so desire, and then let us complete the matter with your Chapter, or that you indicate that the account will receive your attention upon return to civilian life.

Please give present rank, and date of entry into the service.
