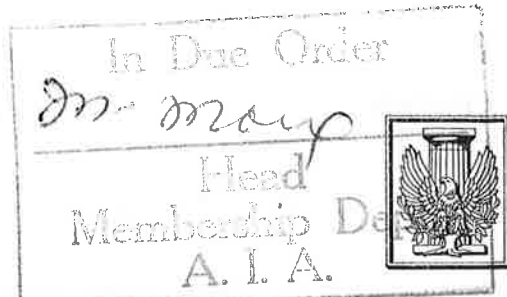

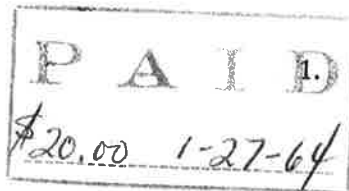

E.H. McDowell

St. Thomas architect E.H. McDowell died Monday in the Veterans Administration Hospital in Puerto Rico following a long illness. He was 61.

McDowell had lived on St. Thomas since 1965. He was a veteran and had been a practicing architect and engineer for more than 25 years.

He was the first black person to be awarded a license to practice architecture in Kansas. He was one of the moving forces behind the founding of the Virgin Islands/Puerto Rico chapter of the American Institute of Architects and served the organization for many years, holding many of its offices.

While serving as a delegate to the national AIA, McDowell was elected to the AIA board of directors and was inducted as an AIA Fellow in 1975 for his work in removing architectural barriers to the handicapped. He served for many years as a member of the national AIA Engineering Committee on Standards.

McDowell completed a number of buildings and projects in the Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and many states on the U.S. mainland.

He also was a member of the Committee of General Purposes of the Harmonic Lodge No. 356 Eastern Caribbean on St. Thomas. He also served as a member of the V.I. Planning Board.

He is survived by his wife, Ava L. McDowell; his father, Dr. Curtis McDowell; his step-mother, Ruth McDowell; a niece and nephew and a host of friends.

Funeral services had not been set Tuesday.
