

We are enclosing a letter from Mr. Angus McSweeney, in which he tenders his resignation from the Northern California Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

The Executive Committee of this Chapter wishes to bring certain facts to your attention before you act upon Mr. McSweeney's request.

For several years, there has been considerable question as to the amount of Supplementary Dues which Mr. McSweeney has been paying to the Chapter. In a recent appearance before the Executive Committee, when questioned about the matter, he stated that he did not choose to conform to the Chapter's dues structure, and indicated that he was paying "all that he felt it was worth to him." Under these circumstances, we must declare him delinquent.

Inasmuch as the Institute By-Laws provide that a man may resign from the Institute only if he is in good standing, we request that the Institute terminate Mr. McSweeney's membership for non-payment of Chapter dues.
