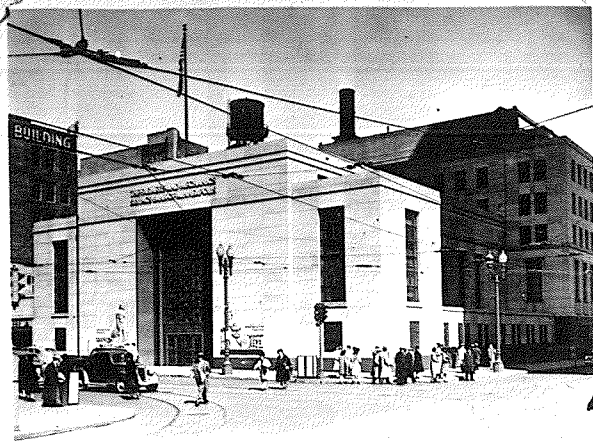

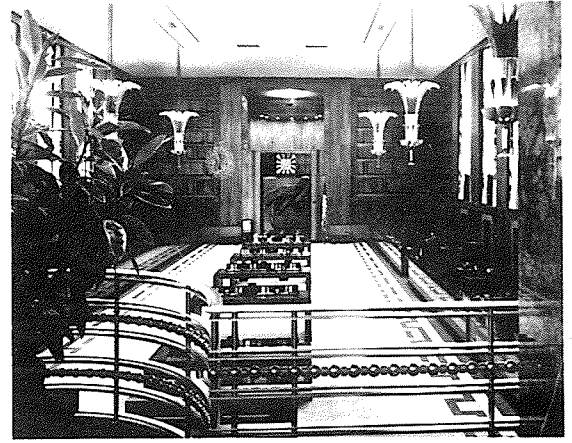

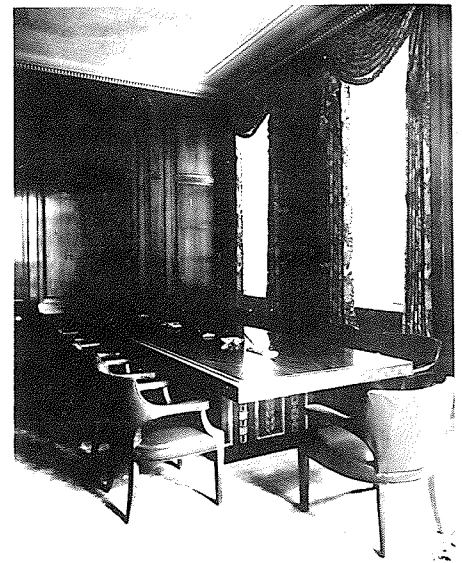
ABOVE - GENERAL EXTERIOR VIEW FROM THE SOUTHWEST
BELOW - DETAIL OF EXTERIOR NEAR MARQUETTE AVE. ENTRANCE



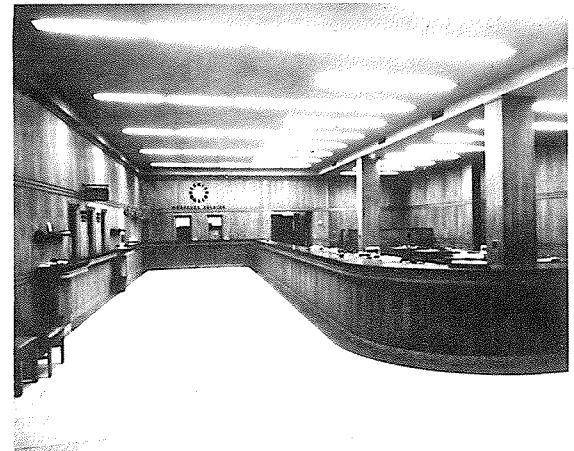
ABOVE - BANKING ROOM FROM BALCONY OVER MAIN ENTRANCE

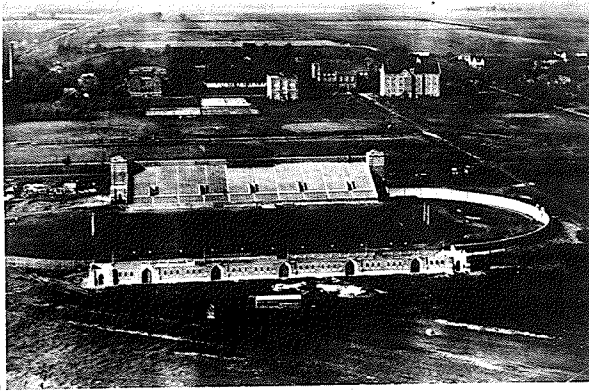

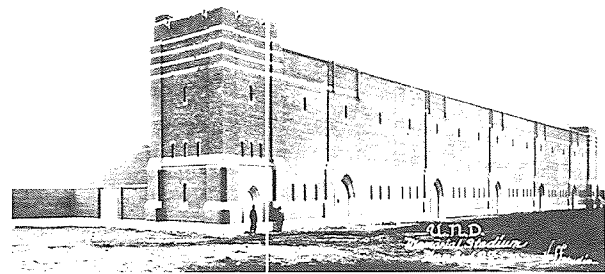

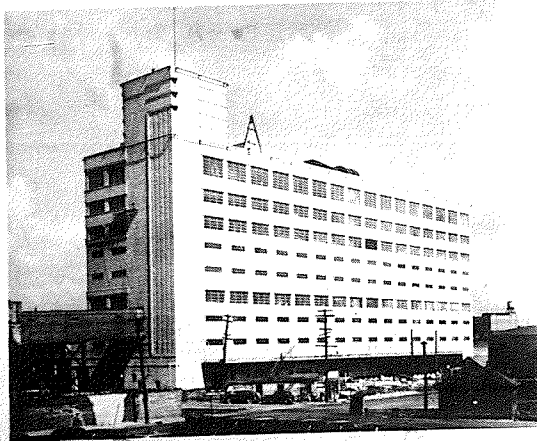
INTERIOR OF MILLER'S CAFETERIA - MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA

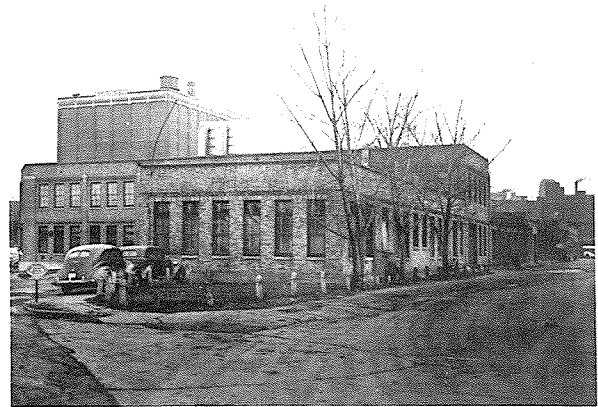
BIRDSEYE VIEW OF NORTH DAKOTA MEMORIAL STADIUM

EXTERIOR VIEW OF FINISHED SECTION OF N. D. MEMORIAL STADIUM



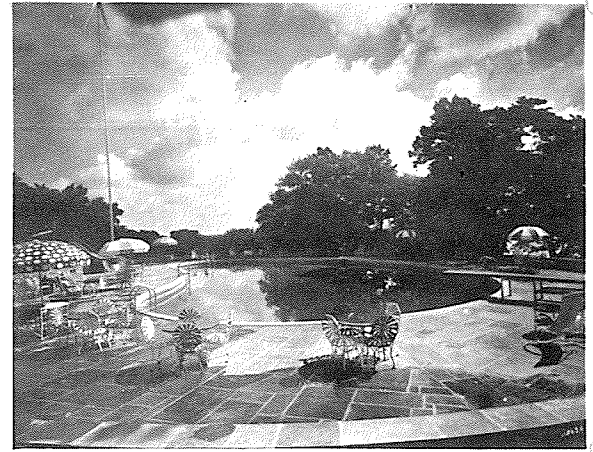

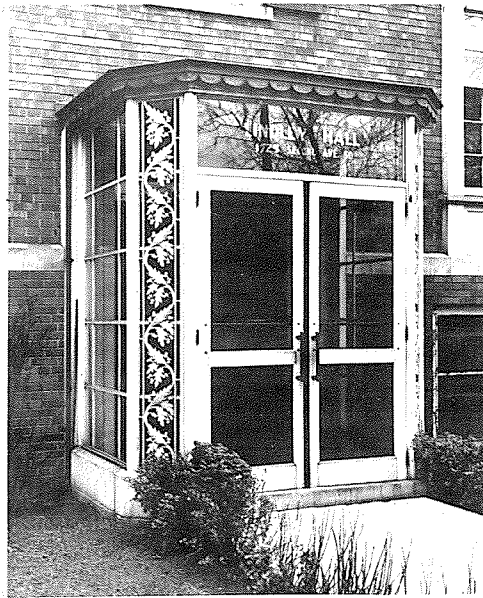

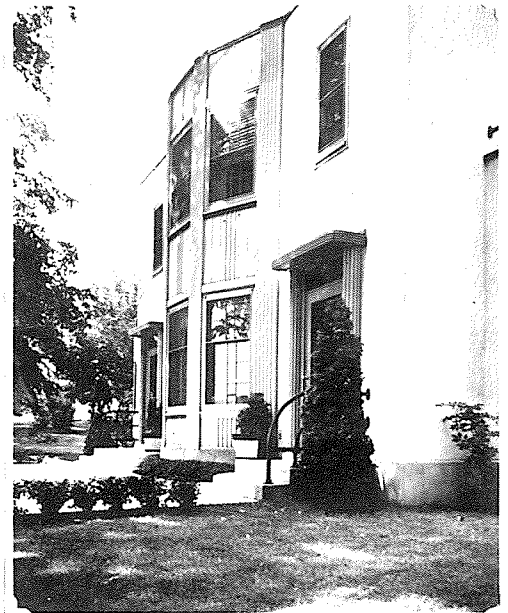
EXTERIOR OF "LINDLEY HALL" - MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA

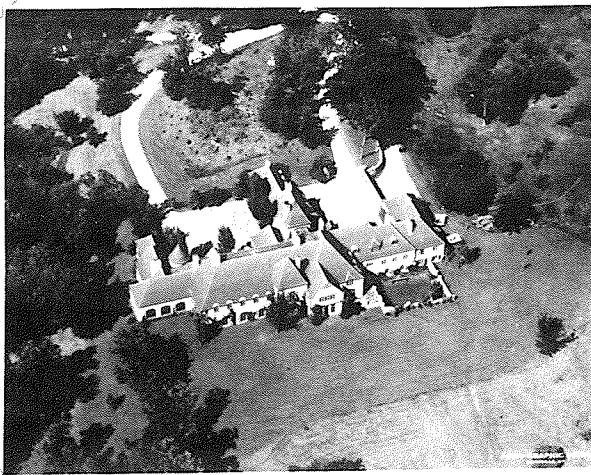
GENERAL VIEW OF SWIMMING POOL, MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA

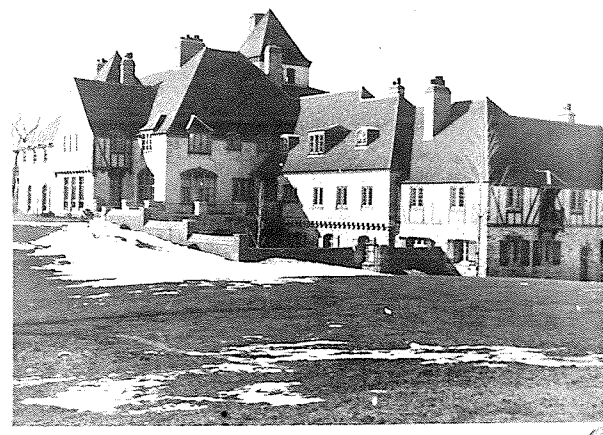
