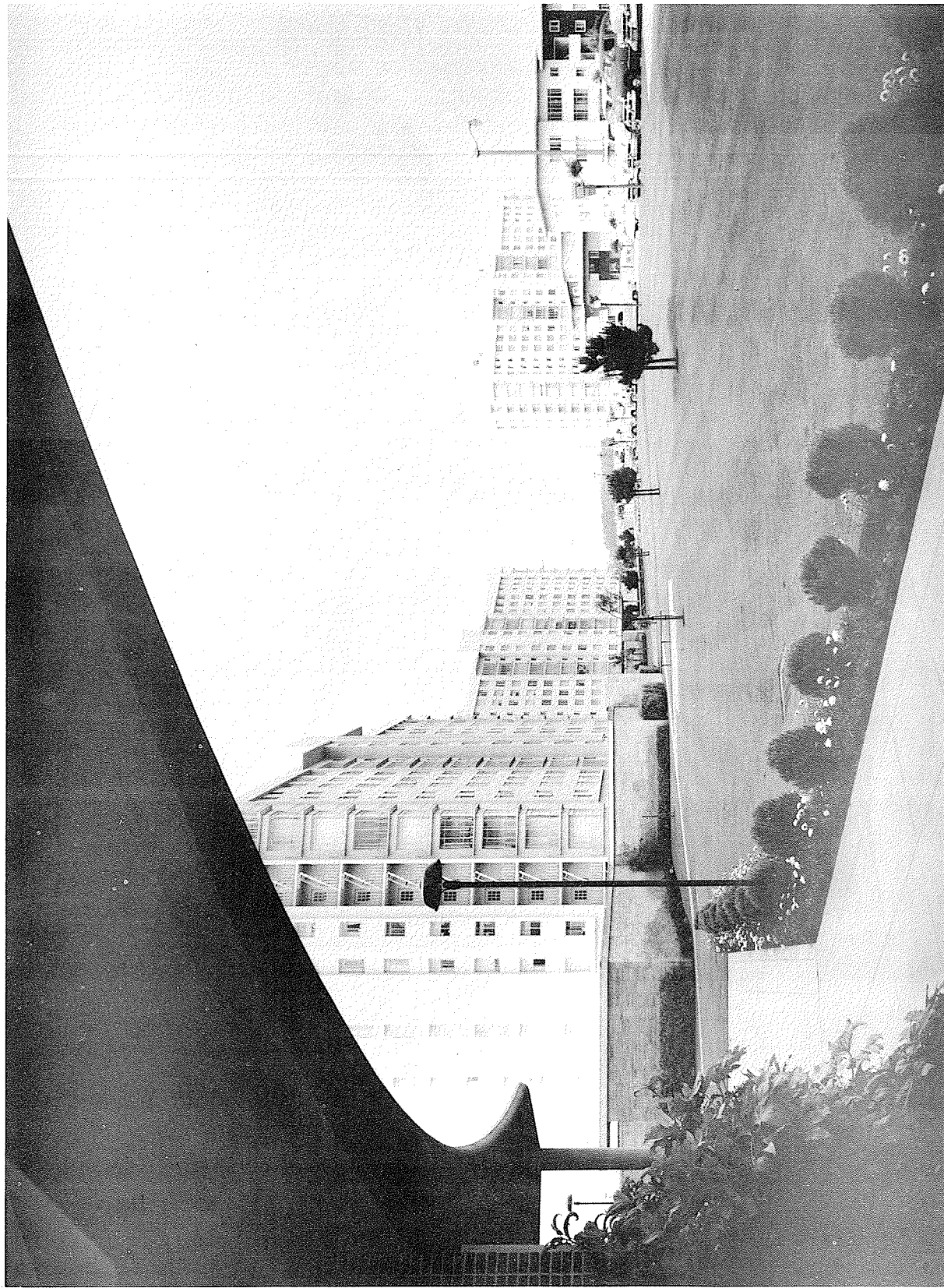
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AERIAL VIEW STONESTOWN APARTMENT PROJECT, SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

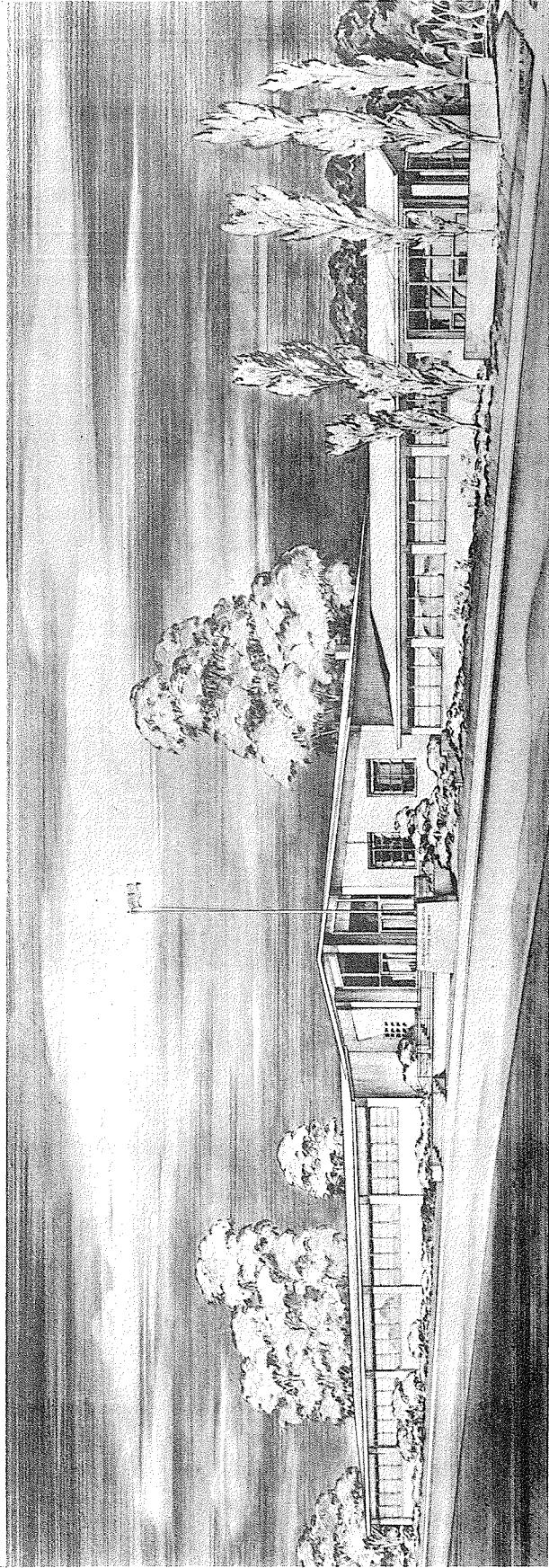

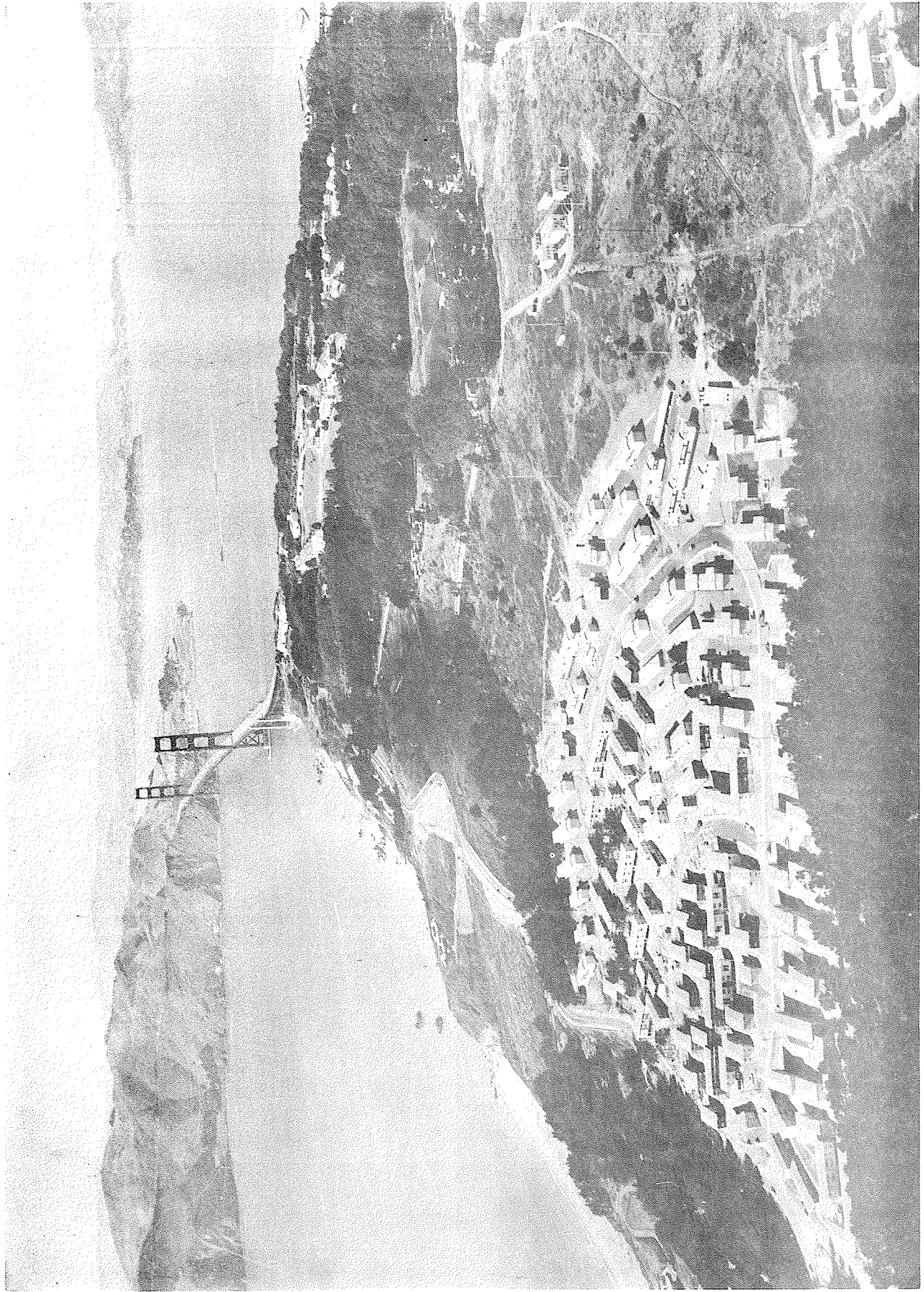
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MODEL OF BUILDING FOR THE PROVIDENCE WASHINGTON INSURANCE COMPANY

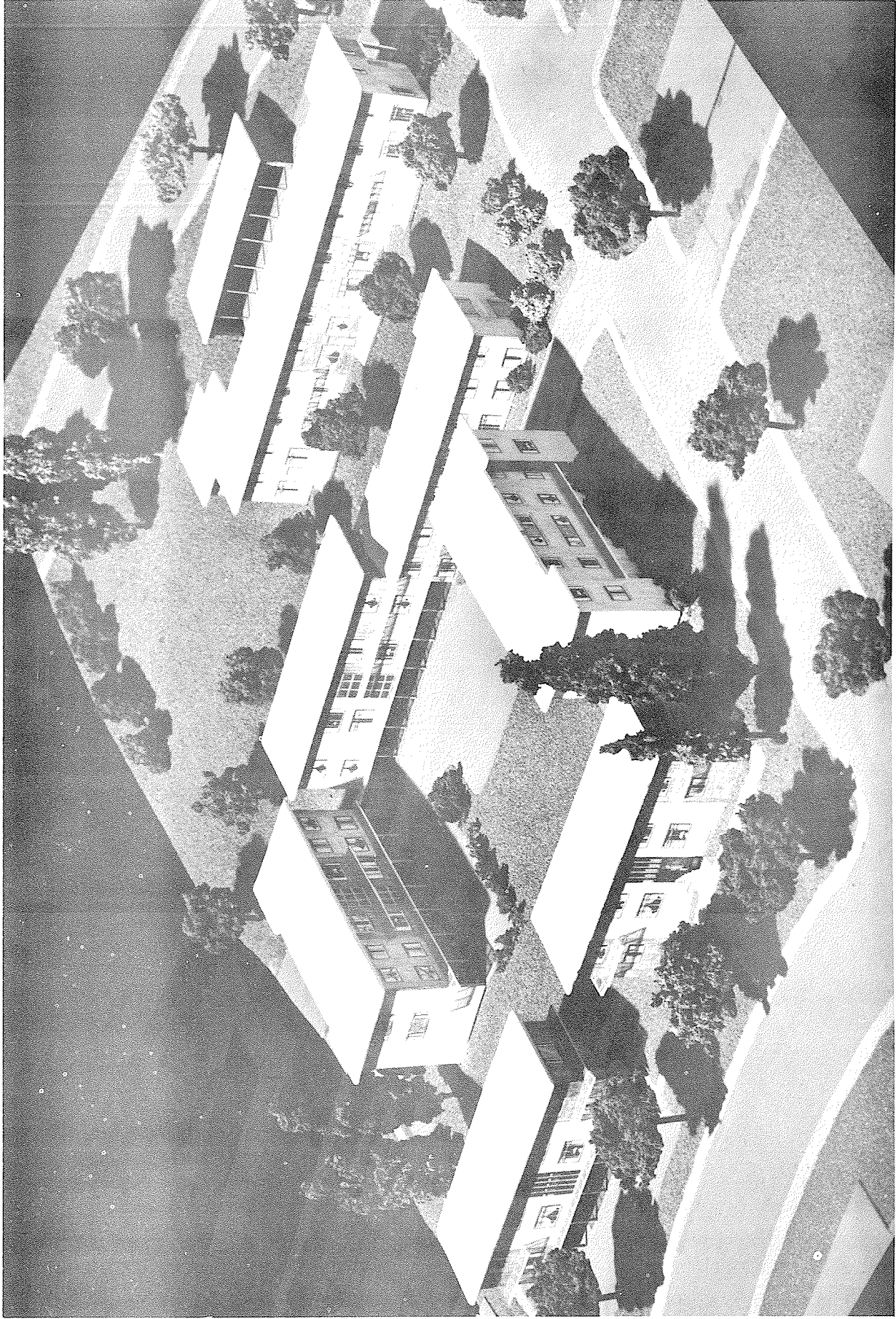
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BAKERS BEACH HOUSING PROJECT PRESIDIO OF SAN FRANCISCO, ANGUS McSWEENEY ARCHITECT

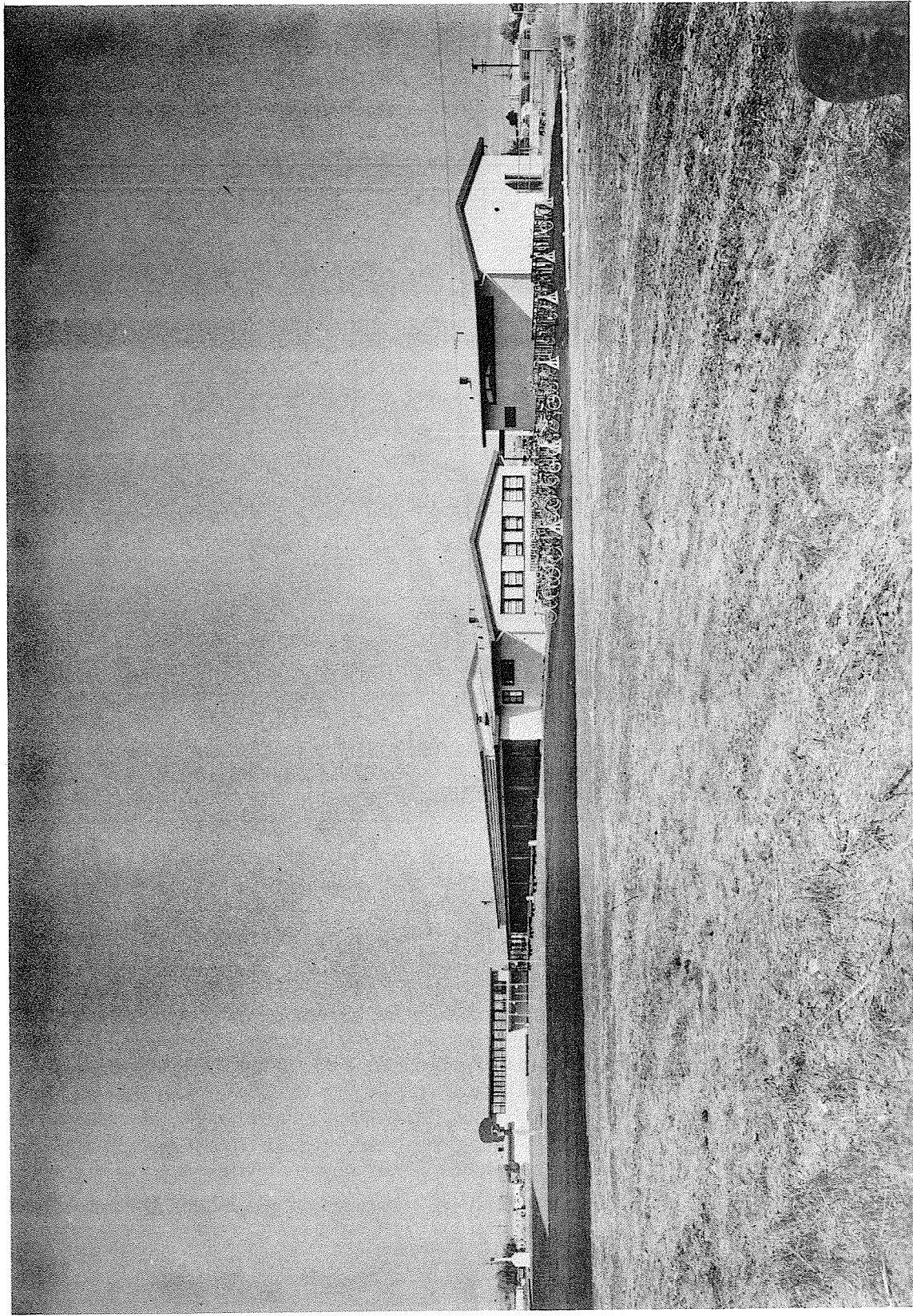

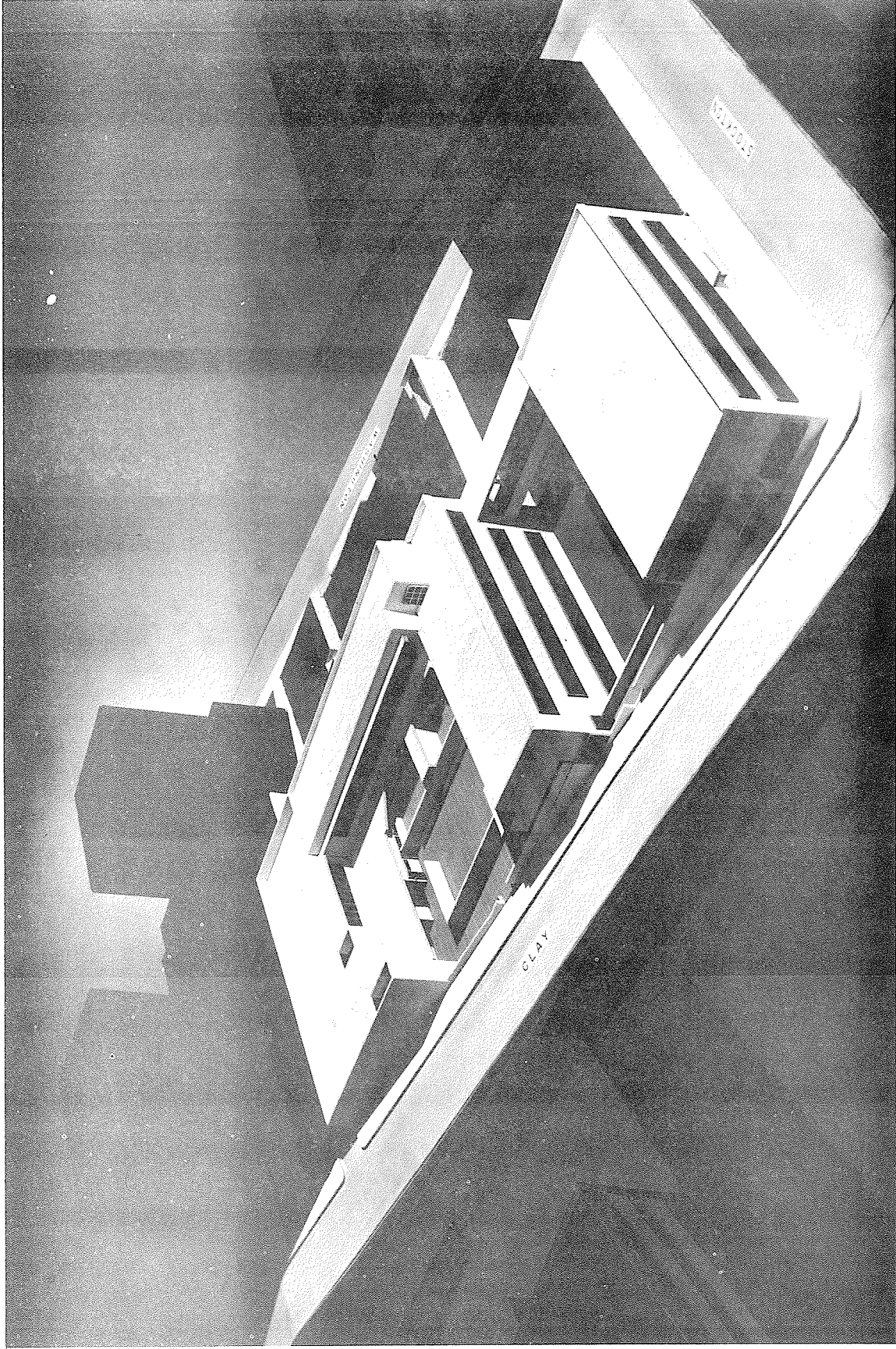
