

MODEL OF BUILDING FOR THE PROVIDENCE WASHINGTON INSURANCE COMPANY SAN BRUNO, CALIFORNIA




BAKERS BEACH HOUSING PROJECT PRESIDIO OF SAN FRANCISCO, ANGUS McSWEENEY ARCHITECT






