#### QUESTION 2:

The qualities of the nominee's design that are considered notable contributions to the advancement of the profession:

Samuel Mockbee has produced a vivid expression of regional architecture through his interpretations of southern building forms. His sense of invention, coupling with common places of the southern landscape, instructs us on the design potential surrounding us. At the same time, his capacity to delight derives from a sensitivity to both his client's immediate requirements and the utility for meeting those requirements inherent in the traditional forms he employs.

All five projects to be reviewed are small and range in cost from \$7,000.00 - \$200,000.00 and four of the projects (Lake Hico Park, Charity Houses, Canton Fire Station and Presidential Hills Church) were designed for minority clients. The fifth project, the Moore Residence, is a home for a three-generation family. These projects demonstrate to us that an architect can achieve self expression within his own boundaries and without limitations attributed to size or budget.

While these projects are representative of Mockbee's work, he has continued to broaden his design base. He is presently responsible for the design of a cultural exchange exhibition between the United States and Russia. This 13,500 square foot exhibition featuring architectural design, product design and graphic design, will introduce American design and designers to the Soviet people.

In the meantime Mockbee has continued to teach as an Adjunct Professor with the fifth year design studio of the Mississippi State University School of Architecture. During the past few years Mockbee has addressed AIA conventions and architectural schools in Kentucky, Arkansas, Georgia, Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi. Perhaps Mockbee's major contribution to the profession is the affirmation he represents to his fellow architects and to students that one can enjoy a modest practice and still achieve excellence in design.






