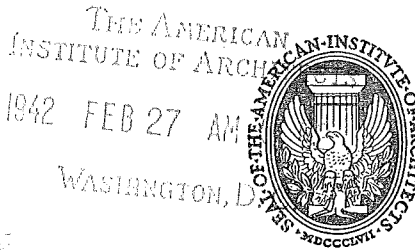

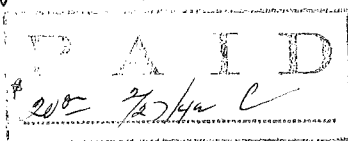

Dear Mr. Kirby:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 24, accompanied by applications for corporate membership in The Institute of Messrs. Mullan, Riesenber, Wilson, and Montgomery.

The applications of the first three named are in due order and will be presented to The Board of Examiners at its meeting on April 7, after which you will be advised promptly of the action taken.

With regard to the application of Mr. Montgomery, which is for reinstatement, the record discloses that he terminated his membership in 1931, at which time he was indebted for Institute dues for 1929 and 1930 amounting to \$50.00. 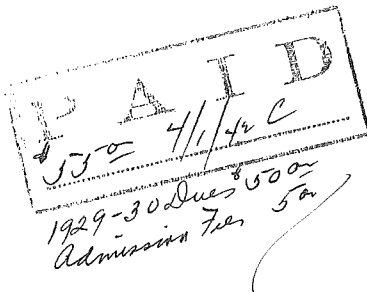
