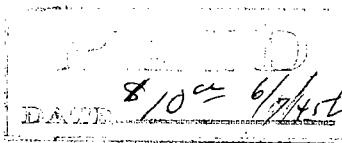

Notice is hereby given that examinations to determine the qualifications of applicants for registration to practice Professional Architecture in Nebraska will be held in the TEMPLE BUILDING, NEBRASKA UNIVERSITY in LINCOLN, NEBRASKA on AUGUST 16-17-18-19, 1939.

Please notify the Secretary of the Board of Examiners at once whether your presence may be expected.

Students of Architectural Schools shall furnish to the Secretary, as early as possible, an official transcript of their college record.

All applicants shall bring scales, triangles, reference books and a T-square 36" or 42" length. Drawing Boards and paper will be supplied by the Board.

The following is offered as a brief indication of the nature and extent of the examination:-

I. MECHANICS OF MATERIALS: August 16, 1939. 8:00 A.M. to 12:00.

Including wood, steel, masonry, foundations, etc., (REFERENCE BOOKS AND DATA ALLOWED.)

CONCRETE AND FIRE PROOFING: August 16, 1939. 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M.
GRAPHIC STATICS.
(REFERENCE DATA ALLOWED.)

II. HISTORY AND ORAL QUIZ: August 17, 1939. 8:00 A.M. to 12:00.

(NO REFERENCES ALLOWED.)

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE: August 17, 1939. 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M.

This will be part written and part oral, and will include a discussion of clients questions, contract forms, specifications, economic questions, inter-professional relations, supervision of construction, etc., (NO REFERENCES ALLOWED.)

III. PRACTICAL DESIGN: August 18, 1939. 8:00 A.M. to 12:00. 1:00 P.M. to 6:00.

This will call for the design of a small library, church, school, or similar problem, calculated to test the ability of the candidate to plan and design logically, and in compliance with the stated conditions of the problem. A part of this period will be devoted to a discussion of the "whats" and "whys" of the problem and the solution of

it as offered by the candidate.

N. B. Under this section of the examination, the Board invites submission by the candidate of a set of plans, specifications and details selected from the work of the candidate done during the past four years, accompanied by notarized statements, showing the nature and extent of the candidates responsibility in connection therewith. (REFERENCE DATA WILL NOT BE ALLOWED.)

AUGUST 19, 1939 - will be devoted to completion of oral sections of the examinations for those candidates who have not been heard during the preceding days of the examination period.

Candidates whose Colloge records are approved by the Board are exempted from the examination in all subjects except those under the headings "PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE" and "PRACTICAL DESIGN", and upon notification by the Secretary to that effect, they need not appear before noon, AUGUST 17, 1939.

In order to secure this exemption, an official transcript of their Colloge record must be in the office of the Secretary by AUGUST 4th, 1939.


