



Prominent Trenton Architect Is Dead

Samuel Mountford, 78, one of Trenton's best known architects, died Thursday at his home, 716 Quinton Avenue. He had been in ill health for several years.

During his years with the architectural firm of Micklewright Mountford, he was instrumental in the design of 150 public school in New Jersey and Bucks County.

Among local projects he designed are the original State Department of Transportation Building on Parkway Avenue, Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, on West State Street and the Trenton Times Building on Perry Street.

He was involved in the restoration of the historic William Trent House and had also assisted the Historical Fallsington Society in its many restorations in Bucks County.

Mountford won first prize in a competition sponsored by the Chicago Tribune for his design of St. Paul's Episcopel Church in Norwalk, Conn.

A veteran of World War I, he was president of the Trenton House Association since

progntion and was a member of the American Institute of Architects, American Legion Post 93, Loyal Lodge 181, F & AM; Sir Charles Napier Lodge 33, Sons of St. George, and the Symposium.

Born in Trenton, Mountford was a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania School of Architecture and also had studied design in France.

He first was associated with the firm of P.L. Fowler Company, which was organized in 1918. Upon the death of Fowler, the firm's name was changed to Micklewright & Mountford in 1940.

The present title of the firm is Micklewright, Hamnett, Bouman and Blanche. Mountford had served as a consultant for the past several years. The firm, long recognized for its school and industrial building designs, is rated among the top 500 architectural organizations in the nation by Engineering News Record.

Mountford is survived by his wife, Maude Miller Mountford) two daughters, Mrs. Richard Kelly of Lincroft and Mrs. Anthony Maruca of Princeton; three sisters, Mrs. Ethel Moore of Seaside Park, Mrs. Henrietta Hendrickson of Levittown and Mrs. Sarah Betts of Summit, and eight grandchildren.

Services will be held Saturday at 2 p.m. in Trinity Cathedral with the burial office offered by Dean Lloyd G. Chattin. Interment will be in Lawrenceville Cemetery under direction of Ivins & Taylor.

There will be no calling hours and contributions may be sent to the Trent House Association.
