Mr. Murphy, as president of the Board of Trustees of the Graham Foundation, has made available to the State of Illinois during the past year two grants, each of \$10,000, which will make it possible for the state to improve its cultural image and services.

The first grant, for a State of Illinois Visual Research Project, will make it possible to determine the opportunities for improving the visual aspects of the State of Illinois wherever the State comes into contact with the public. The investigation covering both the graphic area and functional products, was undertaken by the Institute of Design at Illinois Institute of Technology under the supervision of Director Jay Doblin, and the complete presentation of the final report, recommendations, and prototype graphic pieces should be ready in early December.

The other grant, for a study which will lead to the formation of a state arts council, was made this summer. It will be used for an inventory of the state's cultural and artistic resources.
